

ORDINANCE NO. 319-0

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING POSSESSION OF ALCOHOL BY A MINOR.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TROUTDALE:

Section 1 - Ordinance Title. This Ordinance shall be known as the Minor in Possession Ordinance, and may be so pleaded and referred to and shall apply within the jurisdictional limits of the City of Troutdale.

Section 2 - Definitions. Alcoholic liquor means any alcoholic beverage containing more than one-half of one percent alcohol by volume, and every liquid or solid, patented or not containing alcohol, and capable of being consumed by a human being.

Section 3 - Purchase or Possession of Liquor by Person Under the Age of 21.

(A) No person under the age of 21 years shall attempt to purchase, purchase or acquire alcoholic liquor, except when such minor is in a private residence accompanied by his parent or guardian and with such parent's or guardian's consent, no person under the age of 21 years shall have in his possession alcoholic liquor.

(B) For purposes of this section, possession of alcoholic liquor includes the acceptance or consumption of a bottle of such liquor, or any portion thereof or a drink of such liquor. However, this section does not prohibit the acceptance or consumption by any person of sacramental wine as a part of a religious rite or service.

Section 4 - Affect of Other Laws. This Ordinance shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other state law or county ordinance which is or may in the future be in effect and which relate to the activities regulated by this Ordinance.

Section 5 - Penalty. A person under the age of 21 years who attempts to purchase, purchases or acquires alcoholic liquor, or who illegally has in his possession alcoholic liquor, commits a violation punishable by a fine or not more than \$100.00.
