AN ORDINANCE CHANGING OFFICIAL STREET NAMES AND AMENDING THE OFFICIAL STREET MAP OF THE CITY OF TROUTDALE

WHEREAS, Multnomah County and ORS 227.120 require that all official street name changes be submitted in an ordinance format, and

WHEREAS, the Columbia River Highway was nominated and accepted into the National Register of Historic Places, and

WHEREAS, the Legislature enacted, through Senate mil 766, designation of all parts of the original Columbia River Highway as a Historic and Scenic Highway and further declared it public policy to preserve and restore the continuity and historic integrity of the Historic Columbia River Highway for public use and enjoyment, and

WHEREAS, the City of Troutdale provides a direct link to this highway, recreation areas and tourist attractions, rural service centers and the Columbia River Gorge Scenic Area, and

WHEREAS, the renaming of the Columbia Street to Historic Columbia River Highway will further enhance the correlation of Troutdale to the Columbia River Gorge Scenice Area, and

WHEREAS, the City Council has conducted a public hearing for public comment on this name change and declares such change to be in the public interest.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TROUTDALE THAT:

Columbia Street, between I-84 Exit No.16, east of 244th Avenue, and the western terminus of the Sandy River Bridge be named Historic Columbia River Highway as described in Exhibit A.
