 - Section 2: The Troutdale Comprehensive Plan is hereby amended as shown in Exhibit B.

Section 3: Sections 2.20.010(A)(2) and 2.20.090 of the Troutdale Municipal Code are hereby amended as shown in Exhibit C.

Section 4: These amendments shall take effect thirty days from the date of adoption.

GOAL 1 - CITIZEN INVOLVEMENT

The City of Troutdale encourages involvement of its citizens in its planning process, through service on the Citizens Advisory Committee or the Planning Commission, or by testifying at public hearings. The City makes every effort to inform its citizens about land use actions occurring in their neighborhoods.

CITIZEN INVOLVEMENT PROGRAM

A major component of the City's Citizen Involvement Program is its Citizen Advisory Committee (CAC). The CAC is comprised of Troutdale residents from throughout the city. CAC members not only represent the interests of their particular neighborhood, some members are selected on the basis of their ties to business, environmental resource organizations, or other community service interests. The CAC reviews plan content and implementation measures and participates in the periodic review process. CAC members monitor neighborhood development to ensure conformance to plan policies and guidelines.

The Troutdale City Council serves as the Committee for Citizen Involvement (CCI) which is responsible for evaluating the performance of the CAC and the City's overall Citizen Involvement Program.

POLICIES

- 1. Inform the citizens of Troutdale of land use changes affecting their neighborhoods. The City shall continue to involve citizens in all phases of the planning process via the Citizen Advisory Committee, special task forces, and other appropriate means.
- 2. Keep the public informed of land development proposals occurring in their neighborhoods.
- 3. Attempt to balance the costs of providing public information with the public's right to know.

2.20.010 Committees - General.

- A. The following are the presently constituted committees of the city with the number of members, appointment process, term and authority for each committee:
- 2. Citizens advisory committee:

Membership 11 electors of the city

Appointment Appointed by the mayor with consent of the council. Recommended by seclection committee of the mayor, highest ranking officer of planning commission and highest ranking officer of cititens advisory committee.

Term 3 years - staggered terms

Authority LCDC Goals 1 and 2; Section 2.20.090 of this code.

2.20.090 Citizens advisory committee.

- A. The citizens advisory committee is created as a primary element of the city's citizen involvement program which is established under state laws and regulations pertaining to land use comprehensive planning, including Statewide Planning Goal 1. The citizens advisory committee shall review all legislative amendments to the city's comprehensive plan and all major amendments to land use regulations not reviewed by any other council sanctioned citizen committee. The planning commission may seek the advice of the citizens advisory committee on quasi-judicial amendments to the comprehensive plan. The citizens advisory committee may periodically review and advise the planning commission and council on the citizen involvement program. The citizens advisory committee will report recommendations on land use issues to the planning commission.
- B. The citizens advisory committee shall also perform any other duties or functions assigned by the council. Those duties shall be specified by motion or resolution of the council. In this regard the citizens advisory committee operates to provide policy guidance to the council on matters of public interest and to act as a liaison between neighborhoods and interest groups and the city's elected and appointed officials. The citizens advisory committee will report recommendations to the council regarding issues assigned by the council.
- C. The citizens advisory committee shall be composed of 11 members appointed at large to represent the citizenry of the city. Each member shall be an elector and

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a resident of the city. Although representation on the citizen advisory committee is not based on geographical districts, when appointments are made to the citizen advisory committee, consideration shall be given to geographical distribution of its membership.

D. The citizens advisory committee shall meet whenever there is a land use matter requiring its review and at other times deemed necessary by the committee.

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
