

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING PUBLIC VOTE ON PROPERTY TAX RELIEF, RATE FREEZE AND EXPENDITURE LIMITATION

WHEREAS, the City Council hereby makes the following findings:

1. Citizens of Oregon have demonstrated continual interest in meaningful tax relief.
2. The 1983 First Special Session of the Oregon Legislature has developed an alternative to satisfy the citizens' interest in property tax relief, which includes:
 - a. A sales tax constitutionally dedicated to property tax relief,
 - b. A property tax rate and assessment freeze, and
 - c. A governmental expenditure limitation.
3. After considerable deliberation the Legislature and Governor have concluded this is the best alternative that they can provide the citizens.
4. The enacting legislation requires that a majority of local governments, representing a majority of the state's population, formally have a public hearing on the issue and request application to the Secretary of State.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TROUTDALE THAT:

1. After a public hearing and due deliberation, the Troutdale Common Council concludes that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Troutdale for this measure to be voted on by the people of the state.
2. The City, by approval of this Resolution, makes formal application to the Secretary of State as required by Senate Joint Resolution 30 (1983 First Special Session).


