

RESOLUTION NO. 783-R

DECLARING THE CITY OF TROUTDALE AS A COLUMBIA RIVER HERITAGE CITY AND THE CITY'S INTENTION TO PARTICIPATE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE COLUMBIA RIVER HERITAGE TRAIL AND CELEBRATE IN THE 1992 COLUMBIA BICENTENNIAL.

WHEREAS, The year 1992 will commemorate the first American and British explorations of the Columbia River; and,

WHEREAS, The Columbia River links together the 44 communities and the 18 counties of the Oregon-Washington river corridor which, together, share the heritage of the river history and the economic benefits of its many resources; and,

WHEREAS, The Columbia River Heritage Trail will define, identify and interpret the natural and human history of the Columbia River and the special histories and features of the shoreside cities and communities through which the twin-shore trail will pass.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TROUTDALE THAT:


