

RESOLUTION NO. 936-R

A RESOLUTION CALLING FOR A MAY 19, 1992 MEASURE ELECTION TO WITHDRAW FROM MULTNOMAH COUNTY RURAL FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT NO. 10 AND ESTABLISH A NEW TAX BASE OF \$1,727,488 BEGINNING JULY 1, 1992 TO INCLUDE FIRE PROTECTION SERVICE.

WHEREAS, the Common Council adopted a resolution initiating withdrawal of the entirety of the City of Troutdale from Multnomah County Rural Fire Protection District No. 10; and,

WHEREAS, the Council adopted a resolution stating the City of Troutdale's intent to contract with the City of Gresham for fire protection service; and,

WHEREAS, the Portland Metropolitan Area Local Government Boundary Commission has on its agenda for approval the City of Troutdale's withdrawal from Multnomah County Rural Fire Protection District No. 10; and,

WHEREAS, the Council has complied with the requirements of ORS 310.180 to 310.188 including participation in a meeting to develop a tax coordination plan as confirmed by Addendum A, and incorporated herein; and,

WHEREAS, the Council has conducted a public hearing for citizens and representatives of other units of local government to communicate the effect of the proposed increase in current tax levy authority on other units of local government pursuant to ORS 310.186;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TROUTDALE THAT:

- 1. Call for Election: A measure election, at which the question of withdrawal from Multnomah County Rural Fire Protection District No. 10 and the adoption of a new tax base, is hereby called to be held on Tuesday, May 19, 1992 from the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. (Pacific Daylight Time). This measure shall be submitted to the voters of the City of Troutdale and which, if approved, would allow the City to withdraw from RFPD #10 and establish a new tax base of \$1,727,488, to include fire protection service, to become effective with the 1992-93 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1992.**

2. **Notice of Election:** The notice of election shall be in accordance with Oregon Statue, ORS 310.330, which provides that the County Clerk shall give notice of the election as provided in the general election laws.
3. As required by ORS 199.508, the ballot for the election shall include a statement of the tax base proposed for the City in the resolution for withdrawal under ORS 199.490 (1)(e).
4. **Ballot Title:**

CAPTION: To Establish a New Tax Base to Include Fire Protection.

QUESTION: Shall City provide fire protection by withdrawing from RFPD #10 and establish new \$1,727,488 tax base beginning July 1, 1992?

SUMMARY: Approval of this measure would direct the City of Troutdale to withdraw from Multnomah County Rural Fire Protection District No. 10 and permit the City to provide for the delivery of fire protection and other existing government services. Approval would eliminate the RFPD #10 tax base levied within Troutdale. This measure establishes a new tax base of \$1,727,488 to become effective with the 1992-93 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1992.

The City proposes this change to obtain lower fire protection costs for Troutdale residents. In 1991-92, RFPD #10 protects city areas west of the Sandy River for an estimated \$690,000 tax levy. If this measure is approved, the City would provide for fire protection in these areas at \$576,181 in 1992-93. The new tax base would be adopted as the tax base of the City and used to finance fire protection in addition to other existing government services. The tax base is subject to the limits of Article XI, Section 11, Oregon Constitution. The City's current fiscal year tax base is \$855,589.


The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the county assessor at the time of estimate.



NOTICE OF MEASURE ELECTION

CITY OF TROUTDALE, OREGON

On May 19, 1992, the City of Troutdale, Oregon will hold an election to submit the following measure to the voters of the City.

CAPTION: To Establish a New Tax Base to Include Fire Protection.

QUESTION: Shall City provide fire protection by withdrawing from RFPD #10 and establish new \$1,727,488 tax base beginning July 1, 1992?


