

THIRD ANNUAL WASTE REDUCTION PLAN FOR THE CITY OF TROUTDALE

I. INTRODUCTION

The Waste Reduction Chapter of the Regional Solid Waste Plan adopted by Metro in November 1989, established a Five-Year Work Program for Metro and local governments. Local governments are required to adopt Annual Work Programs which include specific activities outlined by Metro to accomplish waste reduction goals consistent with state law and Metro's Regional Solid Waste Management Plan. Local governments should submit their Third Annual Waste Reduction Plans to Metro by July 1, 1992 for FY 1992-93.

II. SUMMARY FOR FY 1991-92

Last year's plan, which has been completed, included the following activities:

1. Implementation of a uniform and comprehensive curbside recycling program with containers.
2. Regulation of commercial garbage collection that includes economic incentives for waste reduction.
3. Development of a multi-family recycling program in a cooperative effort with the cities of Gresham, Fairview, and Wood Village.
4. Utilization of in-house recycling efforts and purchase of used and surplus property.

III. ACTIVITIES FOR FY 1992-93

- A. Continuation of Ongoing Programs. Troutdale will continue to maintain, promote, and enhance activities begun in prior years. These activities include weekly curbside recycling collection, economic incentives for waste reduction, and in-house recycling and reuse.
- B. Commercial Waste Audits and Recycling. Troutdale will implement a comprehensive commercial waste audit program and designate a contact person for the program. This program will be designed to enable businesses to receive waste audits upon request and will keep records on the number of audits performed. The program will also promote the use of existing waste exchanges and other recovery options. Coordination will be made with DEQ, METRO, hauler, and others to eliminate impediments to commercial recycling.

- C. Construction/Demolition Recycling and Recovery. No later than April 30, 1993, Troutdale will require completion of a brief waste disposal/recycling form when a structure is built or demolished. The purpose of the form will be to advocate waste reduction and recovery options and must include the identity of the disposal/recycling facility to be used to help assure proper disposal and avoid illegal dumping.
- D. Building Design Review. No later than April 30, 1993, Troutdale will incorporate into building design review / site plan review procedures the requirement for recycling areas in new multi-family, commercial, institutional, and industrial developments. These recycling areas must provide space and access to facilitate effective recycling on the part of building users and efficient recycling on the part of haulers.
- E. Home Composting. Troutdale will encourage home composting by providing a credit to the monthly refuse collection bill of any customer who composts in accordance with accepted standards.
- F. Household Hazardous Waste. Troutdale will promote the concept of minimizing the use of products and containers that must be disposed of as hazardous waste and also promote the use of METRO's new household hazardous waste disposal facility. We will also coordinate with METRO to help find appropriate sites for a temporary mobile collection site if needed.
- G. Support Depots. Troutdale will promote the use of recycling depots that accept non-curbside materials, to include temporary depots that collect materials such as phone books and Christmas trees.
- H. Precycling. Troutdale will promote the concept of minimizing the use of products that are excessively packaged or that are packaged in materials that are not readily collected for recycling in the METRO area.
- I. Multi-Family Recycling. Troutdale will actively support and promote the implementation of recycling systems in multi-family units, including prominently placed, readily accessible containers of a acceptable type and quality; training of apartment managers in the effective management of such systems; and promotion/education for tenants. We will also begin planning to offer recycling to all multi-family complexes by FY 1993-94.
- J. Buy Recycled. Troutdale will continue to purchase recycled materials whenever possible.
- K. Assess Viability of New Curbside Materials. Troutdale will continue to assess its curbside collection program and include additional materials as warranted by volumes of material available, technical and economic feasibility of collection, and adequacy of markets.

- L. Record Recycling Tonnage. Troutdale will monitor and record recycling tonnages and participation so that the data can be used to evaluate the effectiveness of recycling and waste reduction programs.

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
