WHEREAS, both parties desire to provide storm drainage services to their constituents in the most efficient manner possible; and


WHEREAS, the Council has authorized and directed staff to continue its dialogue with the Sandy Drainage District concerning matters of mutual interest; and

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN
THE CITY OF TROUTDALE AND THE SANDY DRAINAGE DISTRICT
FOR STORM DRAINAGE SERVICES**

WHEREAS, the City of Troutdale (hereinafter "City") has a responsibility for storm drainage management within the City; and

WHEREAS, the Sandy Drainage District (hereinafter "District") has staff, equipment, physical plant, and experience in providing certain storm drainage services within the District, which includes a portion of the City as well as parts of other political jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, both parties desire to provide storm drainage services to their constituents in the most efficient manner possible; and

WHEREAS, the Sandy Drainage District has resolved to start the process of reorganizing as a not-for-profit public corporation as authorized by ORS Chapter 554.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:

1. The District and the City will enter into discussions that address the following:
 - a. Operation, maintenance, and repair of pump stations, levies, and other flood control facilities to meet current and projected levels of reliability.
 - b. Construction of new facilities and expansion of existing facilities to meet current and projected needs in an equitable manner.
 - c. Development of uniform drainage policies and standards.
2. In pursuit of the above goals, both parties recognize the alleged inequity in having residents who live in both the City and the District pay fees and assessments to both jurisdictions and will strive to resolve this matter in an equitable manner.


