

RESOLUTION NO. 1527

A RESOLUTION AMENDING INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT NO. 301755 BETWEEN MULTNOMAH COUNTY AND THE CITY OF TROUTDALE AS APPROVED BY RESOLUTION NO. 1155 PERTAINING TO THE TRANSFER OF ROADS


THE TROUTDALE CITY COUNCIL FINDS AS FOLLOWS:


1. On January 24, 1995, the City Council enacted Resolution No. 1155 which approved Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) No. 301755 between Multnomah County and the City of Troutdale.
2. IGA No. 301755 established the criteria that the County would be responsible for arterials and collectors that support regional travel and cities would be responsible for local streets and access to the regional system.
3. Application of the above criteria at that time lead to the transfer of Dunbar Avenue, Harlow Place, and Graham Road from the County to the City.
4. A recent review of County roads within the City limits of Troutdale has determined that three additional roads (Hensley Road, 262nd Avenue, and the Cherry Park Road Extension) also meet that criteria.
5. The County and City desire to transfer the above-named three additional roads from the County to the City under the same terms and conditions as the 1995 road transfer by amending IGA No. 301755.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TROUTDALE

That Contract Amendment No. 2 to Intergovernmental Agreement No. 301755 between Multnomah County and the City of Troutdale for Transfer of County Roads, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, is approved.

CONTRACT AMENDMENT NO. 2

to Intergovernmental Agreement No. 301755 between Multnomah County and the City of Troutdale for Transfer of County Roads

1. This is an amendment to Intergovernmental Agreement No. 301755, dated March 9, 1995 and amended on September 8, 1998.
2. Section I (Transfer of Roads) and Exhibit A (Roads to be Transferred to City of Troutdale) of Intergovernmental Agreement No. 301755 identified certain roads to be transferred from Multnomah County to the City of Troutdale.
3. Section I and Exhibit A of Intergovernmental Agreement No. 301755 are amended by adding the following roads to be transferred from Multnomah County to the City of Troutdale:
 - A. N.E. Hensley Road (also known as County Road 565) from N.E. 257th Drive to N.E. 262nd Avenue, a length of approximately one-quarter of a mile.
 - B. N.E. 262nd Avenue (also known as County Road 565) from N.E. Hensley Road to N.E. Cherry Park Road, a length of approximately one-half of a mile.
 - C. The unnamed County right-of-way (both improved and unimproved) directly east of the southern N.E. Cherry Park Road and east of N.E. 257th Drive, also known as Public Road N.E. Cherry Park extension, a length of approximately one-eighth of a mile.
4. The transfer of the roads contained in this amendment will become effective thirty (30) days following the last of the following actions required to effect the transfer:
 - A. Multnomah County provides public notice as required by law.
 - B. Multnomah County conducts a public hearing as required by law.
 - C. The Multnomah County Board of County Commissioners adopts a resolution transferring jurisdiction of the roads to the City of Troutdale.
 - D. The City of Troutdale City Council enacts an ordinance accepting jurisdiction of the roads being surrendered by Multnomah County.
5. Within ninety (90) days after the effective date of the transfer of the roads as described in Paragraph 3 above, Multnomah County will transfer to the City of Troutdale the sum of
$$\frac{[\$4,868 \times \text{number of days remaining in the fiscal year}]}{365}$$

No later than September 30th of each year thereafter, Multnomah County will transfer to the City of Troutdale the sum of

$$\frac{[\$ 4,869 \times \text{Prior Year Annual CPI-U Index for Portland Metro Area}]}{\text{FY 2000-2001 CPI-U Index for Portland Metro Area}}$$

The sums are in addition to those amounts contained in the original Intergovernmental Agreement No. 301755.

6. All other terms and conditions of the contract, excepted as amended herein, shall remain in full force and effect.
