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ITEM 1. ROLL CALL:

Mayor Cox called the meeting to order at 7:10 p.m. and asked to have a roll call.

ITEM 2. PRESENTATION OF REGIONAL URBAN GROWTH GOALS AND OBJECTIVES BY METRO:

Mayor Cox called for the representative from Metro to come forward.

Mark Turpel, Metro, began the presentation of materials. [Materials had been delivered to all members of City Council and Planning Commission.

Turpel reviewed the Regional Urban Growth Goals and Objectives -- Review Draft [gray cover]. Turpel handed out a 'Draft Regional Urban Growth Goals and Objectives Key Issues: 9/24/90" publication for review.

Turpel stated that the Goals and Objectives were developed to be comfortable to the entire region. They would be discussed as to what areas would do what and what tasks would be most appropriate to specific areas. Metro was responsible for boundaries of three counties and those cities within the three counties. Turpel stated that the cities and counties were responsible for their land use plans and Periodic Review.

Discussions included the 5 key issues:

1. Roles - Metro/Jurisdictions
2. Urban Reserves - designated outside and adjacent to existing boundary to offer sites for needed expansions in the future.
3. Economic Activity Centers - limited number of high density, mixed use economic activity centers to be identified.
4. Open Space and Identity - provision of adequate open space and "natural places" inside the urban growth boundary, and the preservation and support of community identity.

Mayor Cox called for this item.


