THE PLANNING COMMISSION TOOK THE FOLLOWING ACTION IN THE PUBLIC HEARINGS

The Chair opened the public hearing at 7:03 p.m. for File No. **LDC-2-08**, an amendment to <u>Chapter 17.08</u>, <u>Definitions</u>, of the Brookings Municipal Code. The Chair announced the hearing was legislative and the Commission will make a recommendation to the Council. The criteria used to decide the matter is found in Chapter 140-Amendments, of the B.M.C.

No exparte contact, personal bias, personal interest, conflicts or objections were declared by the Commission. There was no challenge from the audience as to the jurisdiction of the Commission to hear the request. The Public Hearing was closed at 8:50 p.m. and a vote was taken.

By a 5-0 vote (Motion: Commissioner Gorman) the Planning Commission voted to forward to City Council a favorable recommendation for File No. **LDC-2-08**, with the suggested changes made by commissioners.

COUNTY REFERRELS

Planning Director Morris discussed a County Referral, File No. **CR-PUD-0601/AD-0802**, an application for a proposed conditional use to develop a PUD (Planned Unit Development), located north of the Chetco River, South Bank Development, Inc., applicant.

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The Planning Department received the application and determined it incomplete. A letter fron Planning Director Morris was sent to the County Commission with a list of questions and items needing to be clarified. Morris recommended they deny the application or postpone their hearing until various items are submitted and the application determined complete. A copy of the Memo to the Curry County Commission was distributed to the (Brookings) Commission. Morris concluded both Planner Colby-Hanks and she attended a pre-application meeting with Curry County Planning Director Pratt and the applicants, on Monday, March 3rd. If the application is determined complete, it may be put on the May 6th agenda to be heard by the Brookings Planning Commission.

- Reported on the items scheduled for the next meeting on April 1st, explaining there are two (2) applications to be considered plus review of <u>Chapter 17.88-Sign Regulations</u>, of the Brookings Municipal Code.
