REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY PLANNING COMMISSION July 2, 1957

Members

Present: Messrs. Bullock, Gulley, Hysom, Loring, McVay and Stanhurst, who presided at the meeting during the absence of chairman Goetz.

Others: Willard Spencer.

Mr. Stanhurst palled the meeting to order in the absence of Mr. Goetz. Minutes of the previous meeting read and approved.

Mr. Spencer spoke on the condition of our streets and the need for permanent surfacing. He said it had become necessary to replace the tube in the culvert on Easy St. A plan to black-top Easy Street from the Highway to 2nd. at an approximate cost of \$1700 because of the heavy traffic of logging trucks was discussed by Mr. Spencer. He also spoke of the need to improve Willow street from the highway to Spruce because of it's hazardous condition. Action on these two disprovements was tabled until Mr. Echols could have an opportunity of studing and reporting on them.

Mr. Hysom suggested we call Mr. Echols, which was done, and he promised to make the study and report back at the next meeting of the planning commission.

M C-3 oil process black-topping at $35 \not e$ a running foot was also considered.

The minutes of June 3rd. in which Mayor Campbell advised that it was possible to obtain \$11,000 from the state for blackitopping, was read. Mayor Campbell to be interview in regard to this statement as it could easily solve our immediate street surfacing problems.

A letter from Forrest Hysom in which he asked for permision to lay-out and contruct a mobile homes parking area on Arnold Lane, Tax lot #16. He plans space for 48 trailer homes allowing about 50' for each trailer.

The proper procedure to follow according to our zoning ordinance to allow such a permit was discussed. It was decided that City Attorney, Mr. Balderree, should be requested to give the commission a written statement advising such procedure and to state the time or maximumolenght of time possible in regard to such a permit.

Motion was made by Mr. Gulley, seconded by Mr. Hysom that meeting adjourn until July 16, 1957.
