## SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY PLANNING COMMISSION LOCALISTS

Present: Messrs. Bullock, Goetz, Gulley, Hysom, McVay and Stanhurst.

Minutes of the previous meeting read and approved.

Committee appointment by Mayor

Mr. Goetz reported that Mayor Campbell had appointed a committee of three councilmen and two members of the planning commission to work out aprogram on street oiling. Mr. Gulley and Mr. Bullock to act from the planning commission.

Mr. Gulley reports on council meeting:

Mr. Gulley reported attending the last meeting of the City Council. He said defective fire-place flues had been discussed and those built by Horton Sr. or Horton Bros. would be repaired if faundndefestivethy the fire marshall, by Don Horton at his own expense.

Engineer from Coos Bay

Mr. Gulley said that an engineer from Coos Bay had offered his services as city engineer on the sewage disposal plant and other matters needing engineering advice.

Report and request from Library Board:

Mr. Gulley said that a report and request from the Libary Board was read to the effect that funds be allocated for the improvement and landscaping of the library grounds. He reported that the condition of Easy street came in for a lot of complaint and discussion.

A deal wathpMn. KBankuseto open King Street was on the verge of being signed, Mr. Gulley said.

Mr. Gulley also said that our Recommendation #46 to the City Council initiating the oiling of streets, was unanimously approved. Newly appointed committee to meet Wenday night Oct. Ath. and select certain streets for this year's improvement and the establishment of an assessment district if necessary.

A letter from Wm. Brady in regard to the proposed state high-way route past Rainbow Rock, was read by the secretay. The concensus of opinion was that the Planning Commission had no jurisdiction in such matters.

Acquisiton of Mild Beach for park purposes was discussed and Mr. Hysom to get written statement from the owner, Elmer Bankus as to what he requires and will do in the matter of giving this property to the City.

The questionaire from the League of Oregon Cities regarding their annual meeting -- program etc. was discussed and answered.

Importance of joint action between Port Commission and Planning Commission unsmattersaid interest to both groups, was stressed.
