

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY PLANNING COMMISSION
March 19, 1957

Meeting called to order by chairman, Roy Weideman.

Members present: Messrs. Bullock, Goetz, Loring, Stanhurst and Weideman. Others: Mayor Campbell and City Engineer, Mr. Martin.

Minutes of the previous meeting read and approved.

Report On Recommendation to City Council #40. Mayor Campbell said that the Council had approved this recommendation.

The need for a street sign at the foot of Hillside avenue was discussed and Mayor Campbell was asked if all the street signs had been put up. Mr. Campbell promised to look up the matter.

The need for checking fire hydrants to see if they are in working order was also discussed. The Mayor reported that the fire chief had been checking and that the hydrant at 270 Pacific was not in working order. It was suggested that the city only pay for the hydrants that are usable.

City Engineer, Mr. Martin was present to give information on paving standards. He said he would be in Salem the coming week end and would contact the State Highway Department for recommendations for light, medium and heavy traffic paving. He pointed out that the base used was as important as the paving itself and should be considered.

The traffic hazard at the postoffice was discussed with Mr. Martin, who agreed to study the situation and get the suggestions and approval of the State Highway Department and report back to the commission.

Mr. Martin pointed out the need for planning for more parking area, and suggestion was made that the Chamber of Commerce acquire 20 or 30 acres outside the city for industrial purposes.

The need for control of river front development was approved.

Motion was made by Mr. Loring that meeting adjourned.
