MINUTES OF HEARING ON PRENTION OF IRA BROWN, June 21, 1958

The Planning Commission convened in special session at 9 0 clock, P.M. for the purpose of hearing arguments for and against the petition of Ira Brown to re-zone his property from an R-2 and A-1 to a Tourist Commercial Dist. C-1.

Planning Commission members present: Chairman Goetz, Messrs. Gulley, Loring, McVay, Molino, and Stanhurst.
Others were Mr. & Mrs. Grootendorst, Dr. Cate, Mrs. Redfield, Mrs. Clare, and Messrs. Brimm, Pototnick, Ebinger and Connie Bordwell and Mrs. Clark representing the press.

Mr. Ebinger expressed his belief that the effect of re-zoning in this area would definitely be a detriment to other property owners. He believes it should be reserved for a residential area and asked that the petition be disallowed.

Mrs. Redfield, Mr. & Mrs. Grootendorst and Margo Clare agreed with Mr. Ebinger's statements.

Dr. Cate said he had signed the petition but had since that time requested Mr. Brown to take his name off the petition. He too agreed with Mr. Ebinger.

Mr. Gulley asked if anyone present could suggest a good site for a trailer park. He pointed out that if we are to enforce the new trailer ordinance, we had to provide trailer accommodations. He emphasized the seriousness of this situation.

Mr. Brimm voiced objections to the new trailer ordinance and said he had property that might provide a trailer park site.
Mr. Goetz and Mr. Gulley reported that the Commission is trying to provide a permanent trailer home site.

There being no further objections oral or written, the commission declared the hearing over, and excused those present.

A dsicussion on the sufficiency of the petition was held. It was decided to hold action until the next meeting of the Commission on July 1st. and ask Mr. Brown to be present to answer questions concerning his plans.

On motion by Mr. Stanhurst, meeting adjourned.
