CALL TO ORDER

Motion: recommend to City Council the 2018-19 Parks Capital Improvement Plan List as determined by the Commission.

<u>Background/Discussion</u>: Park projects are identified for the upcoming fiscal year prior to the beginning of Budget Committee Meetings. Staff presents the list of projects to the Parks and Recreation Commission for approval and recommendation to Council.

The list of projects is a work in progress, beginning with priority projects identified in the Parks Master Plan as well as the addition of projects developed by staff as requested by Council and the Commission.

The list of projects identified for 2018-19:

Azalea Park – Band Shell Sidewalk Repairs, Grading and New Grass \$16,000 (Gen. Fund)

Azalea Park – Lower Parking Lot Repairs & Expansion

\$24,000 (SDC)

Projects currently approved in parks for fiscal year 2018-19 include Azalea Park Ball Field Reconfiguration Phase 3 and the Chetco Point Park Memorial Trail. Both projects are funded in part by grants and donations.

Subject: Compassionate Friends Memorial Bench - Azalea Park

RE: THE COMPASSIONATE FRIENDS MEMORIAL MONUMENT

Dear Commissioners:

The Northwest Coast Chapter of The Compassionate Friends kindly requests permission to erect a beautiful, new memorial bench in Azalea Park, to be located on the existing concrete pad and immediately next to the existing Compassionate Friends memorial bench approved in 2015.

The Compassionate Friends (TCF) is a non-profit self-help bereavement group assisting those grieving the death of their son, daughter, grandchild or sibling. The local Northwest Coast chapter is one of nearly six hundred chapters in the United States and has been helping the bereaved within our community since 2004. During the past fourteen years we have communicated with more than two hundred fifty bereaved individuals in the southwest Oregon and northwest California communities we serve. In addition to holding monthly meetings we offer a bimonthly newsletter, grief related pamphlets, library of grief books, summer BBQ, December dinner, and annual Candle Lighting program. We operate solely on donations and charge no fees or dues for our services. Eight local bereaved individuals oversee chapter operations. We also have an Advisory Board of individuals who, because of their profession or avocation, are in contact with the bereaved and provide our chapter as a resource. Everyone associated with the local chapter is a volunteer.

Many individual TCF chapters across the country have erected memorial monuments in scenic locations for the purpose of remembering those who have *gone too soon*. In 2015 our chapter oversaw, with the assistance of two of our Advisory Board members, the placement of the existing memorial bench in Azalea Park. Response to this beautiful memorial has been ongoing, as it provides great meaning and comfort to those remembering the, primarily, sons and daughters whose names and dates are etched into the bench.

The new bench would be of the same material and design as the existing granite bench. The existing concrete pad, paid for by our chapter, is of a size to easily allow for a second bench. This new bench would, like the first, face the stage and provide comfortable seating for anyone enjoying the park. There would be no need for removal of vegetation or pouring of addition concrete. Our chapter will cover all costs for the granite bench and its placement.

The new bench will look the same as the existing one, with a quotation in the front and center of the backrest and names and dates on both sides of the quote. Etched onto the backside of the backrest will be our local chapter name, date and names of project partners.

Enclosed for your review are photos of the existing concrete pad and bench, in addition to the view from the proposed location for the new bench. Also enclosed are a list of individuals currently serving on our Steering Committee and Advisory Board, a TCF fact sheet and a few of the more than forty brochures we distribute to the bereaved.



Subject: Parking Lot Lighting – Azalea Park

<u>Motion:</u> recommend Council accept a donation of \$13,060 to be used to purchase and install parking lot lighting in Azalea Park.

<u>Background/Discussion</u>: Parking in Azalea Park is limited for night time events when they occur. Visitors to the park for events often find themselves relying on vehicle headlights to find their way to their cars when leaving the park. This occurs mostly during the Natures Coastal Holiday light show event. When this event has its highest attendance, all parking lots are full and require volunteers to perform traffic control due to either poor or lack of lighting.

Natures Coastal Holiday (NCH) is proposing to fund the purchase and installation of seven light pole assemblies for the Capella and lower parking lots of Azalea Park. They are requesting the work be coordinated through the City and be ready for use during the 2018 NCH Event.

Financial Impact: none...all cost covered by NCH
