## MINUTES CITY OF BROOKINGS PARKS & RECREATION COMMISSION April 5, 1972

Members present: Chairman Allan Ettinger, Marshall Hoppin. Dellis Oliver, Ron Westeren, and H. Lee Hansen. Also Mayor Williams, Councilman Long and Superintendent of Public Works Elmer Lee.

Meeting called at 7:35 p.m.

Minutes of last week's meeting read, approved.

Budget for coming year was first order of business. Fence cost price for Easy Manor Park as figured by E. Lee will be \$3,486.15 (@ \$4.50/lin. ft.). MOVED by Mr. Oliver, seconded by Mr. Hoppin that a full amount of \$3,500 be submitted to City Council for fiscal year 7/1/72 to 6/30/73. Approved unanimously.

Mayor asked members to discuss several replacements for this Commission. Names approved were Rev. John Lacy, Presbyterian minister, and Don Smith, Plywood Company employee.

Ron Westeren announced, with regret, his resignation effective April 17, 1972. He will be moving to Bend where he has secured employment.

Old business. City Marine Park. Ron Westeren joined discussion about acquisition by the city of the land in vicinity of the old Chetco River bridge and Chetco cannery. This had been erroneously termed a marine park. Council members Kemp and Long were asking Council to buy it for city use. The Commission voted to modify the original minutes of March 15, 1972, on this subject, as shown on the typed minutes of that date.

Marshall Hoppin said he is working with the Jaycees on their cooperation with our park playground equipment program. He borrowed equipment catalogs and price lists and the order sheets approved by this Commission to show the Jaycee committee. report on this at next meeting.
