## MINUTES CITY OF BROOKINGS PARKS & RECREATION COMMISSION MAY 2, 1974

Members present: Chairman Allan Ettinger, Del Oliver, C. Fix, John Lacy, and Lee Hansen. Also Elmer Lee, Supt. of Public Works.

Meeting called to order at 7:40 p.m.

Minutes of March 7, 1974, read and approved.

Elmer Lee reported that all fence materials for the Easy Manor Park arrived last week and is stored in the city yard near the post office.

Chairman Ettinger reported a balance of \$603.00 left in the Commission's account. This money must be used up before June 30 or it will revert to the general fund.

The Chairman asked Elmer Lee to find a post hole digger. Commission members will dig holes for the posts. A Saturday was determined to be the best day for the group to do the work.

Clarence Fix reported that free fill material may be available at the Port of Brookings to level off the park area before holes can be dug. Elmer said 1,000 yards will be needed. Lacy and Hansen volunteered to talk to Floyd Somers about the marina fill material to use in the park.

The Chairman appointed Hansen to let him know if and when the material had been hauled so he can notify members of the Commission to get to work on digging the holes and planting the posts. Elmer said a city cat can be used to level off the park area after the fill has been delivered.

Elmer said that rest rooms will be necessary. Lacy suggested that the mechanical drawing class at the high school be contacted to draw up plans. Chairman Ettinger appointed him to make the arrangements. Building size needed would be 10' X 22', concrete blocks preferred. Men's side will need one toilet, one urinal, and one wash basin; women's side will need two toilets and a wash basin. Elmer suggested that local merchants be contacted for material donations for constructing the building. The city will provide the pipe and the concrete and the water.
