RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS it is in the interest of the citizens of Troutdale, residing as they do near the confluence of the Sandy and Columbia Rivers, to have the best sewage disposal facilities possible available to all of those residing in the Sandy River and Lower Columbia water sheds, both for the protection of the purity of the waters of said rivers and also for the preservation and protection of the water supply of the Town of Troutdale, and

WHEREAS it appears inevitable in the face of the current population explosion and expansion in Eastern Multnomah County, that residential developments will occur in all areas appurtenant to the Town of Troutdale, and

WHEREAS sewage disposal development in Eastern Multnomah County should occur in conjunction with a master or over-all plan for sewage disposal development, but that the most economic means of developing the sewage disposal facilities in the Troutdale area is through the auspices of the Town of Troutdale, and

WHEREAS the Town of Troutdale has adopted a policy of encouraging annexation to it where this is the most logical development of the area in light of the benefits available to the residents to the Town of Troutdale,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the policy of the Town of Troutdale, with the respect to the supply of sewage facilities to residents of the Town of Troutdale and the area adjacent thereto, shall be

1. Sewage facilities available now and hereafter under the ownership, operation and maintenance of the Town of Troutdale shall be made available to all persons reasonably accessible to said sewage facilities.

2. The charges for such sewage facilities shall be designed to amortize the capital investment of the Town of Troutdale together with all incidental costs and to fairly distribute the burden of the operation of such facilities. It will be the policy of the Town of Troutdale to recognize that the property owners of the Town of Troutdale bear a greater

burden, both actual and potential in connection with the supply of such sewage facilities, and that therefore there will be a variation between the sewage charges for all purposes between those resident and those non-resident in the Town of Troutdale.

3. That in those areas that are contiguous to the Town of Troutdale wishing sewage facilities, the Town of Troutdale will encourage them to annex where it appears that the areas will be otherwise benefited by such annexation.


4. This Town Council recognizes that it does not have the power to bind successive Councils by this resolution, but that this resolution is one of intent and purpose.


