WHEREAS, THE STATE OF OREGON, acting by and through its Oregon Transportation Commission, has caused to be prepared and submitted to the CITY OF TROUTDALE an agreement providing for the improvement of Southeast 6th Street from Buxton to Harlow Streets.

AGREEMENT
SPECIAL CITY ALLOTMENT FUND
Project by State

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into by and between the STATE OF OREGON, by and through its Department of Transportation, Highway Division, hereinafter called "State", and the CITY OF TROUTDALE, a municipal corporation created and existing under the laws of the State of Oregon, by and through the corporate officers, hereinafter called "City";

W I T N E S S E T H

RECITALS

1. Pursuant to the provisions of ORS 366.800 and 366.805, there has been withdrawn from state highway funds appropriated for allocation to the several cities of the State of Oregon the sum of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand and No/100 (\$250,000) Dollars, and said sum has been set up in a separate account to be administered by the Transportation Commission and to be spent each year by said Commission upon streets not a part of the state highway system within cities which are receiving excessive wear through sudden increases in population in the area or heavy and unusual traffic.

2. City desires to share in the benefits of said law and for such purpose has requested State to consider a project for the improvement of the following described street or streets, or portions thereof:

Southeast 6th Street from Buxton to Harlow Streets.

3. State has considered said request of City for said project and has determined that said street or streets, or portions thereof, are not a part of the state highway system and are receiving excessive wear through sudden increase in population in the area or heavy and unusual traffic and need to be improved.

NOW, THEREFORE, the premises being in general as stated in the foregoing recitals, and IN CONSIDERATION of the covenants, conditions, provisions, and terms hereinafter set forth, it is agreed by and between State and City as follows:

GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF SAID PROJECT AND APPORTIONMENT OF COSTS THEREOF BETWEEN STATE AND CITY

1. Said project shall consist of the following:

Grade, base and pave a 36 foot wide street.

Attached hereto, marked Exhibit "A" and by this reference made a part hereof, is a print showing the location and limits of said project.

2. The costs of said project shall be apportioned between and paid for by State and City as follows: State shall pay the cost of the project, excepting concrete curbs and sidewalks, not to exceed Twenty-five Thousand and No/100 (\$25,000) Dollars, and City shall pay the total cost of concrete curbs, sidewalks and any additional cost of the project in excess of said Twenty-five Thousand and No/100 (\$25,000) Dollars. The estimated cost of said project is Twenty Five Thousand Five Hundred (\$25,500) Dollars; however, the actual costs, whether more or less than said estimate, shall govern and control.

THINGS TO BE DONE AND OBLIGATIONS ASSUMED BY CITY

1. City shall provide without cost to State all rights-of-way clear of all buildings, structures, and other improvements, and all easements, rights, and other interests in real property necessary or deemed necessary by State for said project.
2. City shall, without cost to State and in accordance with the provisions of its charter and ordinances, reestablish the grades of all streets in which grade changes are made necessary by said project.
3. City shall, without cost to State, relocate or reconstruct, or cause to be relocated or reconstructed, all water, sewer, gas, electric, telephone, telegraph, railroad, street railway, and all other utility conduits, lines, poles, mains, pipes, tracks, and facilities of every kind and nature made necessary to be relocated or reconstructed to conform with the proposed plans and ultimate requirements of said project.
4. City shall save harmless and blameless and shall indemnify the State of Oregon, its Transportation Commission and members thereof, its officers, employees, contractors and agents from all lawful claims, demands, damages, actions and suits and costs of actions and suits, whatsoever, arising out of or as a result of the acquisition, appropriation, or use of said rights-of-way, easements, rights and other interests in real property, the change of grade of any existing street, including but not being limited to liability under ORS 373.040, and the relocation and reconstruction, or failure to properly relocate or reconstruct said utility facilities of every kind and nature.

5. Upon completion of said project, City shall assume and be solely responsible for the maintenance of said street or streets, or portions thereof, involved in said project.

6. City understands and agrees that State's participation in said project is solely for benefit of City and that State, by said participation does not assume any jurisdiction or control over said street or streets, or portions thereof, and shall be under no obligation to maintain same.

7. City represents to State that it has adequate funds available and at its immediate disposal for the City's share of the project covered herein, as provided for in paragraph 2 under "APPORTIONMENT OF COSTS BETWEEN STATE AND CITY ABOVE".

8. In the event that the project requires funds in excess of Twenty-five Thousand and No/100 (\$25,000) Dollars, the City shall promptly upon demand by State deposit such a sum of money as when added to the said Twenty-five Thousand and No/100 (\$25,000) Dollars will equal the estimated cost of the project as revised pursuant to the successful contractor's bid; it being further understood that in the event City is required to make said deposit, that when the entire project has been completed and the total cost thereof determined if the said sum deposited exceeds the City's share of the total cost of said project, then the surplus shall be refunded to City. If, however, the said sum deposited does not equal City's share of the total cost of the project as provided for in paragraph 2 under "APPORTIONMENT OF COSTS BETWEEN STATE AND CITY" above, then City shall promptly upon receipt of an itemized bill from State, pay to State such an amount of money as when added to the said sum deposited will equal City's share of the total cost.

9. City shall adopt an ordinance or resolution, as the case may be, authorizing the Mayor and Recorder to enter into this agreement, and the same shall be made a part hereof and attached hereto.

THINGS TO BE DONE AND OBLIGATIONS ASSUMED BY STATE

1. State shall prepare plans and specifications for said project, and State shall have exclusive jurisdiction, discretion, judgment and control over the design of said street or streets, or portions thereof, and all other construction details and matters involved in said project.

2. State shall, when in its judgment the public interest would be served best thereby, by contract, or by other means within its discretion, perform and accomplish said project.


IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have subscribed their names and affixed their seals.

The project, the basis for the within agreement, was approved by the Oregon Transportation Commission on September 24, 1975, at which time the Highway Administrator and State Highway Engineer was authorized and director to sign said agreement for and on behalf of the Commission. Said authority is set forth in Volume 3, Page _____, Minute Book of the Oregon Transportation Commission.


