C__Y COUNCIL PARK PURCHASE COMMITTEE MEETING

March 4, 1976

Commissioners present: M. Mahoney, R. Dix, S. Cox, F. Kaiser, Atty B. Freeman, Rec. B. Bergstrom, Mayor R. M. Sturges

Meeting called to order at 7:25 PM.

Discussion among those present concerning recent meeting proposing 242nd as the ideal arterial from Gresham to the freeway $80N_{\circ}$

The Mayor presented the question of our proposed park purchase. Atty. B. Freeman explained the obligation of the city to pay the entire amount in full before grant funds are released from Salem, for partial (1/2) payment. At this time the City is hard pressed to come up with that much money either in this budget or next years. After considerable discussion it was felt by the committee that the City must regretfully decline to purchase said property and release the grant. This will be proposed at the next council meeting for the other members to make a motion on the issue and solution.

The problem of the land for the Depot relocation was discussed revealing that the formerly leased land from the Railroad is now going to cost the City \$500 a year approximately for each of the two parcels totaling nearly \$1,000 a year. One of these parcels is directly involved in the turn-around planned for the Depot as a busistop and could wreck the planned use of the Depot. Since time is limited and the Depot is scheduled to be moved this week, it was felt we should stick to the original plan of placement of the depot and work out the problem with the railroad as quickly as one can. Either buy the land in question, or pay the lease new amount if necessary, or move the depot to a better spot.
