Report by Mr. Jean. Reference by Mr. Jean as to progress on new license regulatory ordinance in accordance with Business Income Tax negotiations with Multnomah County and State of Oregon. Revisions requested by Gresham on County proposed ordinance for East Co. cities.

AGENDA ITEM #5 - PLANNING COMMISSION REPORT

Mr. Murphy reported Collier fence variance approved; application for 5 mobile trailer houses as classrooms by Reynolds approved; Spikes final subdivision plat of Burnacci property approved; Andersen preliminary tabled; Allegre zone change approved; Heckel zone change with conditions approved; Windust zone change approved with conditions; Burlingame zone change approved with conditions; Bennett application design review postponed.

Mr. Jean introduced Tom DeJardin of Grantech who proposed to investigate over a 3 month period at \$500 fee on a trial basis grant search on behalf of Troutdale. Mr. Jean discussed advantages of engaging professionals in search activities. Mr. DeJardin spoke on achievements for Portland, Alaska, and other communities. He spoke on programs in Congress, planning, engineering, and steps in the acquisition process. Commissioner Althaus questioned unemployment statistics affecting recent grant loss to Gresham. Mr. Jean met with Gresham officials in an effort to retrieve the grant loss but to no avail as of yet. Discussion by council and staff.

AGENDA ITEM #7 - ALLEGRE ZONE CHANGE LOT

Mr. Murphy (P/C) read Planning Commissioner report. Slides presented viewing property, existing structure, private driveway, garage, and slopes. Petition presented by Sandy Dell residents against zone change. Application noting several points of concern such as drainage, increased Stark traffic hazard, Sandy River flows, and others. (see attached)

Mayor announced election results show both measures of tonight's election have

Commissioner Althaus questioned R-10 zone having deed restrictions as this lot does not seem to be legally sound and engineering should question drainage issues in view of past history of this lot.

City Attorney, Brian Freeman, recommends R-20 zone and creating an ordinance, amending it if necessary at a later date.

Proponents: Robert Allegre spoke noting R-10 & Troutdale ordinance regulations. As for road issue, he does not feel 5 additional houses would cause detrimental impacts as alarming as petition suggests.

Opponents: Mr. Bob Clifton read petition in full (attached) signed by 16 property owners affected. Petition noted:

- 1. Violation of class soil use.
- 2. Street Hazard.
- 3. Drainage issue
- 4. Traditional land use: F-2 conpatible with scenic area.
- 5. Increase trespass violations if road is improved and traffic increased. Most concerned as to safety of street egress and ingress. Extremely hazardous now, noting 7 deaths have occurred at that corner since others have resided there. Council discussion with Mr. Clifton.

Mr. Howard read easement 1965 where 5 owners who subsequently divided original 5 lots into 16 lots now protesting further splits.

Dr. Frank Packard, Road Comm. President, spoke noting he is in conflict with Planning Commission on this issue. Road is now the responsibility of Sandy Dell District since 1957 when \$7,000 road rebuilding cost was spread. In 1975, traffic count showed average of 60 crossings a day. In 1977, this increased to 100 crossings a day. Hazard would increase with this plat.

Mr. Ascher spoke asking a council condition be that this subdivider should enter into an agreement to reimburse NuPacific for bringing offsite services within usable distance to this development.

Commissioner Kaiser moved to close public hearing.

Break at 9:30 P.M. Resumed at 9:40 P.M.

Mr. Murphy read Planning Commission report. Slides viewing property in relation to Pearl Heights construction and Raspberry Lane construction. Planning Commission findings reviewed by Mr. Murphy and recommendation by staff proposal consistent with both present Comprehensive Plan and newly proposed Plan.

Proponent: Mr. Reed, representing purchaser, feels proposal consistent with both old and new plan. Also, he feels need expressed for owner occupied residences with regard to schools in area and college.

Mr. Bonner (planner) stated strength of design terminates land use of previous plat in northern density use and still does not bind southern property owner to duplex use. Commissioner Weissenfluh questioned who owns adjacent property. Mr. Murphy could not recall name.

Bob Johnson, CAC participant, asked if less density not needed in view of constructed duplexes now vacant near fire station? He does favor this plat design generally.

Commissioner Cox moved to close Public Hearings.

AGENDA ITEM #9 - WINDUST REZONE

Mr. Murphy reviewed Planning Commission report. Slides presented of property, showing benches or slopes between Second & Third Streets, behind City Hall. He noted density use could be increased by Council over A-2 restrictions limit. Existing house to be removed and plat to be completed within 4 years. Neighbors to be contacted before final plat approval and general development plan as well as storm run-off issues. Commissioner Weissenfluh questioned project height and sq. footage restrictions. Murphy & Building Inspector, Sharpe, gave information.

Proponents: Frank Windust and Norm Larsen spoke noting part of lot in commercial area and part in higher density use area, noting noice factors affect this property. In May, 1977, a survey of consturcted units showed Barclay Square Apts, 14 units, no vacancy; Wood Villa Apts., 48 units, 1 vacancy; Treehill units, 125 units, 4 vacancies; Tristy Ann Apts., 9 units, no vacancy — total 196 units, 5 vacancies, 2.5% vacancy factor. Our rentals are never empty for over 2 weeks. Feel there is a definite need for housing we are proposing. A-2 to A2PD consistant with Comprehensive Plan & consistent with proposed zoning plan for this area, public need for housing proposed, PD classification appropriate. Preliminary plan proposes 20 units on 38,000 sq. feet, one unit per 1,900 sq. feet; two 8 unit apartments and one 4 unit = 20 units. Park and open places with existing fruit trees preserved, walkways added, and other foilage and trees. Natural growth between single existing family on Third and my units would be preserved as noise and viewing buffers.

Opponenets: Mike Frick (neighbor) stated new plan not compatible to this proposed zone request. Maximum allowed 12.6 units. Not all of property in high density area. Four acres required and this lot not 4 acres. Already established apartments across the street. Too much saturation in one area of heavy use multiple dwellings. Computation erroneous for parking, play, open area and 20 units.

Commissioner Althaus questioned is density the issue Mr. Frick? Mr. Frick replied he objects this does not conform to present Comprehensive Plan. Only half of property conforms to this density.

Mr. Murphy stated A2PD does exist under new plan and does exist in present plan under which we are still regulated. Under existing plan, 16 units permissible but 20 would require a determination by Council. Discussion by Council fellowed.

Rebuttal: Norm Larsen spoke that removal of \$20,000 existing residence to be replaced by one 4-plex upgrading area and better land use planning.

Bob Johnson spoke supporting higher density use but parking not adequate for two 8-plexes and one 4-plex in this plat design.

Commissioner Kaiser moved to close Public Hearing. Seconded by Commissioner Cox.

Proponent: Warden Davis, representing Burlingames, noted important plat aspect is conformance to existing plan as well as policies of proposed plan. Stark Street grade severely limits commercial use here. Demonstrated location on map.

Mr. Jean reviewed project proposals accepted for CETA funding. Mr. Ralph Appleman, designer, presented drawings for long-range remodeling plans. He demonstrated suggested replacement window he recommends for City Hall as second step along with insulation of building, following excavation of area under meeting hall to be completed as first step. Review of preliminary drawings authorized earlier by Council were discussed. Commissioner Cox and Kaiser appointed unamimously to head subcommittee, reporting to Mayor on development of plan to be recommended for Council approval. Mr. Appleman to work on hourly basis until further direction or approval by Council and payment for preliminary plans of \$500 approved. Mr. Jean reported on funds authorized by CETA to fund this project consist of excavation & foundation labor and materials approved. Contract signed by CETA & City on grant appropriation agreements.

Mr. Lee suggested Council read his Storm Sewer Study Report and call if any questions. Mr. Ascher commented on Lee's tendancy to grossly oversize systems of major trunk rather than increment design oversizing.
