# CITY COUNCIL MEETING

# MARCH 14, 1978

Mr. Murphy gave report on Baker/Milwaukie Conflict between zone and policy area. Problems and conflict between zoning ordinance and Comprehensive Plan.

Mr. Murphy suggested July 16 for City Picnic. Commissioner Weissenfluh made motion for July 16 picnic. Commissioner Althaus seconded.

Mr. Murphy reported that a conditional use fee has been established in the amount of \$250, however, the City has never had a conditional use ordinance or resolution. A conditional use is one that could be exercised in a transitional area under certain circumstances and conditions. If the Plans meet certain setbacks, design criteria, performance standards then a conditional use can be allowed in a certain zone at Council and Planning Commission's discretion. The conditional use permits which are to come before the Planning Commission have to be postponed until after passage of a conditional permit ordinance.

Commissioner Weissenfluh brought to the attention of the Council the shut-down of a couple of subdivisions because of streets not being cleaned. Mr. Jean mentioned that the dirt in the streets is a public works health hazard. Mr. Murphy reviewed the process used to notify the developers, by letter, that there was going to be a clean up. They were to clean up by Friday at 4:00 p.m. or else they would possibly shut down in the building site or the whole subdivision on Monday morning. The first Monday came and the staff did not do anything, nothing happened in the field, the second Monday came and we shut down almost every subdivision. Almost everyone said the City was right they will clean it up and a couple hours later it was cleaned up and opened. Most of the developers said this should have been done a long time ago as they have been after their builders all year. More discussion followed.

Mayor Sturges read Ordinance #255 (by title - "AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO CLEAN-UP OF CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS DURING THE DEVELOPMENT OF PROPERTY, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.")

Commissioner Kaiser moved to adopt Ordinance #255. Commissioner Cox seconded.

Mr. Jean asked that a sentence should be added "as Council finds a public emergency exists."

Mr. Murphy asked that the Council approve a provision that the annexation fee for the Port of Portland be deferred until after the Boundary Review Board acts favorably on the annexation.

Commissioner Kaiser moved to waive the prepayment of the annexation fee until 30 days following the Boundary Commission approval. The Port has to pay the fee. Commissioner Edwards seconded.

Agenda Item #5 - Interim Street Lighting Policy

Mr. Jean gave report (copy attached). If we had an operating budget to pay for streetlights which we don't, we would require the developers to put the lights in under schedule B where they would buy the lamp and the pole and the City would take over the maintenance and operation via PGE. The City would accept a guarantee that they would do this if the levy passes and if the levy does not pass for the operating budget then they would be released of this obligation.

Commissioner Kaiser moved to accept the Interium Policy to be used by the Planning Commission. Commissioner Edwards seconded.
