Daoust stated that he is looking forward to continue serving the City.

4. PUBLIC COMMENT

Mayor Thalhofer called this item.

Gary Penning, Waste Mgt., thanked the council and staff for their assistance in the transition from Ege Sanitary. It has been six months and things are going well.

Beverly and Runyon Jackson, 2117 SE Beaver Creek, voiced concerns with neighbors who have an above average number of cats. Have tried for a year to get the problem solved. One neighbor is a renter and the city needs to look at which is more important, renter or owner. One neighbor is a city employee and that is part of the problem. There is information in the City Code that was with held from us by the administration. The cats are a health risk to one of the small children in the neighborhood who has allergies. It is not right for the city to cover this up because one of these people is a city employee. We are the only ones that will come forward publicly. This renter is running us out of our homes. The code could have been enforced.

Mayor Thalhofer stated that he and the City Administrator me with the Runyons recently and is working on a solution to this problem. Resents the allegation that the employee is be favored over anyone because that is not true. As we explained in the meeting we are waiting for the M/C ordinance, when it comes we will review it and take action at that time, we can't take action on something that has not come yet.

B. Jackson stated that she has tried to solve this before coming to a public meeting and accusing the Mayor and City Administrator of a conspiracy, but why, if the code has existed since 1989 hasn't anyone informed us of it or enforced it. This is a health and human rights issue.

Mayor Thalhofer stated that the city will study the issue.

Mayor Thalhofer called this item, recessed the council meeting and opened the public hearing at 7:26 p.m.

Faith review the staff report contained in the packet.

Council discussed attendance of the current members.

Mayor Thalhofer closed the public hearing and reconvened the council meeting at 7:38 p.m.

PUBLIC HEARING / ORDINANCE INTRODUCTION: An Ordinance Adopting Amendments to the Troutdale Development Code Relating to Design Standards for Central Business District - Subarea D.

Mayor Thalhofer called this item, recessed the council meeting, and opened the public hearing at 7:39 p.m.

Faith reviewed the staff report contained in the council packet.

Councilor Kight voiced concerns regarding a % of space being reserved for signage along the

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rear wall, rather than an exact amount of footage.

Council discussed this issue.

Councilor Ripma asked if this item was reviewed by the Maydews?

Faith stated that the Maydews submitted the originals, which were refined by staff. Sheryl Maydew is on the Town Center Task Force and was part of the discussions that took place.

Councilor Ripma asked that for the next packet the Maydews provide information on % vs. exact amount of square footage.

Councilor Ripma voiced concerns if there should be further investigation regarding regulating content of this sign and the signs referred to in Section E, of the proposed Ordinance.

Sercombe stated that he would have information regarding sign content at the next meeting.

Mayor Thalhofer closed the public hearing and reconvened the council meeting at 7:55 p.m.

7. DISCUSSION: A Discussion on the Jail Issue.

Mayor Thalhofer called this item.

Dan Oldham and Lieutenant Greg Shar, M/C Sheriff's Office, updated the council on the passage of the G.O. Bond and the Levy and reviewed the uses for this money. Also, informed the council on the site selection process for a new facility, need 35 - 60 acres, currently looking at several sites would like to narrow down to 8-10 sites. A resolution is proposed for the County Commission to develop and empower a Site Advisory Committee, which will be charged with selecting a site by January 1997.

Mayor Thalhofer voiced opposition to have the new facility in Troutdale.

Oldham stated that Troutdale would be informed if there is a site within the City being considered.

Councilor Kight asked if there will be someone from Troutdale on the Site Advisory Committee?

Oldham stated that if there is candidate site within Troutdale then yes. We do not know what the candidate sites are at this point. You will be provided with the list.

Councilor Ripma voiced concerns with the committee everyone on the committee is going to vote for a site not in their area, feels it will be a waste of time.

Oldham stated that the county hired a consulting firm with experience in this area, Barny Worth, to help in the site identification process, the committee is part of their recommendation.

Council discussed this issue.

Councilor Ripma requested a copy of the Barney Worth report and the resolution being submitted to the M/C Commission.

Oldham stated that would be provided.

Mayor Thalhofer asked the Jacksons if they would be available to discuss their concerns during the break with City Attorney, so that if there is action needed the council could act tonight.

The Jacksons agreed.

Mayor Thalhofer called for a break at 8:23 p.m. and reconvened the meeting at 8:48 p.m.

Sercombe stated that there may be some enforcement activity, in regards to the Jackson's concerns, that was previously planned for Thursday morning in conjunction with the county, if that action is not successful, then the city will again meet with the Jacksons to explore other options.

Mayor Thalhofer voiced concerns over not knowing about possible remedies through the code, should have been informed. Also, voiced concerns regarding the allegations made by the Jacksons, there has been no favoritism regarding city employees.

8. DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

Mayor Thalhofer called this item.

Gazewood reviewed his report contained in the packet.

Mayor Thalhofer asked for information regarding the drowning earlier in the evening a the community park.

Newton provided the council with the information he had available.

Faith drew attention to the section of his report concerning rezones that will be coming before the council.

Kight complimented Community Development on the B.C. Canyon Steps.

Ortega stated that Well #8 is up and running and updated the council on the construction on 257th.

Kvarsten stated that he is the person that is ultimately responsible for the effectiveness of this organization and if there is any fault in our responsiveness or actions in any way the responsibility rests squarely with me.

9. COUNCIL CONCERNS AND INITIATIVES:

Councilor Regelein stated that he is looking into the possibility of adjusting the hours of construction so that everyone is happy.

Mayor Thalhofer voiced concerns about the dangers of swimming in the Sandy River.

10. ADJOURNMENT:

Mayor Thalhofer called this item.

MOTION: Councilor Smith moved to adjourn. Councilor Ripma seconded the motion.
