1. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE, ROLL CALL, AGENDA UPDATE

Council President Thompson called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and called on Councilor Kight to lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

City Recorder Martinez called the roll.

Council President Thompson explained that Mayor Thalhofer is in Salem at the Legislature and would be arriving shortly.

Council President Thompson called this item and read the consent agenda.

MOTION: Councilor Ripma moved to approve the Consent Agenda. Councilor Kight seconded the motion.

Council President Thompson called this item.

Steven Rodrigues, voiced concerns that the Troutdale Development Code does not allow drive-thru businesses in the Central Business District. He owns a drive-thru espresso business in Wood Village and would like to open one at the corner of Hist. Col. Rvr. Hwy. and 257th. Asked the Council to consider initiating a Text Change to the Development Code to allow drive-thru espresso stands.

The Council discussed this issue and reached consensus that Rodrigues should apply for a zone change through the Planning Commission.

 DISCUSSION: Potential transfer of urban land use planning functions to local jurisdictions.

Mayor Thalhofer called this item.

Dan Saltzman, M/C Commissioner, and Scott Pemble, M/C Planner, informed the Council that MPAC, which is made up of representatives from 23 local government agencies and the three counties in the metro area, has been reviewing the impacts of the Metro 2040 study and is realizing that the impacts of that study will be here by 2015. In an effort to address these impacts on the region in an more effective way the County is requesting that the local governments assume the planning functions for the pockets of unincorporated M/C that would most likely eventually be annexed by the local governments, the county is currently performing these functions. Would like the local governments to explore this request and have it in place by September 98. Would allow the local governments more control over how they would meet the density targets for their city as set by the 2040 plan. Appeal procedure for property owners would allow them to appeal to the County Commission, which are their elected officials.

Council discussed this issue and directed staff to meet with county officials and come back with recommendations.

DISCUSSION: Final report on the 257th Avenue Enhancement Study.

Mayor Thalhofer called this item.

Faith reviewed the staff report contained in the packet and introduced Tom Armstrong who was the consultant on the study.

Armstrong presented the study and recommendations as contained in the packet.

Council discussed the study and commended Faith, Armstrong, and the Task Force for the work they have done and the quality of the final product.
