- 1. Call for bids - Fire Department Equipment**

The Brookings Fire Department requested authorization to call for bids for equipment, which was budgeted for in the 1991-92 Fire Department Budget. The call for bids will be for the purchase of eight (8) sets of firefighter turnout gear and eight (8) helmets. The approximate cost of this equipment is \$5,000.

- 2. Report on bids - Public Works - generator for shop truck**

Staff called for bids for a generator for the public works shop truck. Only one bid was received, that being from Cascade Electric Motor Service, Inc., for a total purchase amount of \$2,841.76. The specifications for the generator were met or exceeded, and staff recommended award of the bid to Cascade Electric Motor Service, Inc.

- 3. Change Order No. 6 - Dawson Tract Sewer and Water Improvements - James W. Fowler Co.**

James W. Fowler and Company submitted Change Order No. 6 for the Dawson Tract Sewer and Water Improvement Project, Schedule A. This change order is for the purpose of requesting payment for a non-contract item barricade constructed at the west end of West Harris Heights Road at a cost of \$300.00, and to request reimbursement for 15 passed compaction tests at a total cost of \$1,291.41.

In the recent update of the business license ordinance and business license fees, the wording for the business license fee for half-year was left at \$25.00 in the ordinance. E. Golf Board

City Attorney Mike Gillespie indicated that he is in the process of drawing up the Lease Agreement for the Jack Creek Golf Course, and requested authority to ask another attorney to review the draft. He suggested that Tim Sercombe, an attorney in Portland who is familiar with golf course leases, be retained to review the document.

Councilor Davis moved to authorize the city attorney to submit the final draft of the Jack Creek Golf Course Lease Agreement to Attorney Tim Sercombe for review, with submission back to the council possibly at the March 23, 1992 council meeting, which motion was seconded by Councilor Brimm. The clerk called the roll with the following results:

XI. STAFF REPORTS

A. Community Development Director

1. Acceptance of Right-of-Way Deeds - Van Dyke Subdivision - Dawson Tract

This subdivision, recorded as Harris Beach Estates, is located at the most southerly end of Dawson Road. It is a recorded subdivision approved by Curry County prior to the area being annexed into the City of Brookings. The design engineer found, in designing the streets, that he needed some additional right-of-way for fire department turn-around and to have the right-of-way to have the sidewalks and curb on a radius.

Councilor Davis moved to accept the right-of-way deeds for the Van Dyke Subdivision, as presented by staff with new maps, which motion was seconded by Councilor Curry. The clerk called the roll with the following results:

2. New water testing requirements and procedures - Paul Strader

Treatment Plants Chief Operator Paul Strader gave a presentation concerning new water testing requirements and procedures contained in the Safe Drinking Water Act. No formal action required.

Mr. Strader also invited the council and the audience to come to take a tour of the new and upgraded wastewater treatment plant. The tours are being conducted on March 10, 11 and 12.

Mayor Hummel moved the next agenda item ahead due to audience participation.

D. City Attorney

1. Comparison of City and County CTR Agreements

At the March 2nd work study meeting, council had questions on what comprised the CTR reported "revenue generated by current rates" and the dollars and policy of the closure/post closure issues. CTR has responded on the revenue question, indicating that all revenue as outlined in the contract definition is incorporated within the "current rates" revenue amount. The closure/post closure issue will need to be discussed by the city attorney.

The council had some questions concerning language regarding the Port Orford Landfill. It was council consensus that all references to the Port Orford Landfill should be deleted from the proposed agreement. CTR owner Pete Smart was directed to contact the attorney to advise him of the decision. The attorney will submit a new agreement to City Attorney Gillespie. **No formal action taken.**

B. Police Department

1. Downtown parking survey results

On February 25, 1992, Reserve Officer John McKinney contacted eighteen business owners on Chetco Avenue between Oak Street and Pacific Avenue and asked them to complete a questionnaire concerning on-street parking on Chetco Avenue.

When asked, "Is existing time limit acceptable for parking?", fourteen said or implied yes. Four said no and wanted a variety of different time limits, from 2 hours to all day.

Sixteen of the eighteen want additional off-street parking. Many want the old Shell Station torn down and parking in its place.

Four businesses asked for increased enforcement of the parking limits.

General concerns for the majority were:

1. The need for more off-street parking.
2. Tear down old Shell Station - put in parking.
3. Some business owners are the worst offenders of parking limits.
4. No one-way street.
5. Need more signs.

The four businesses that would like the one-hour limit changed are:

1. Richard Greenlee - his clients need 2 hours to complete their business.
2. Curry Collections - wanted 2 hours.
3. The Learning Center would like all day parking.
4. SOCRATES would like at least 4 hours but they will be moving in about 30 days.

Councilor Curry moved to take no action at this time on the parking survey results on Chetco Avenue, which motion was seconded by Councilor Brimm. The clerk called the roll with the following results:

C. City Manager

1. City Manager Dennis Cluff advised that a grant had been applied for from the Meyer Trust to enhance and enlarge the Summer Youth Recreation Program. A letter was received this date stating that the application was not approved, with no specific reason given. **No formal action required.**
2. Report on bids - Water treatment plant and water intake upgrades

Bids were opened at 3:00 p.m., March 9th. The engineers were present to evaluate the bids and had them ready for council action.

Bids received were as follows:

H.G.E. recommended the bid be awarded to the apparent low bidder, E.M.K. Construction, at a total cost of \$177,600.

Councilor Davis moved to award the bid for the water treatment plant and water intake upgrades to E.M.K. Construction at a total cost of \$177,600, which motion was seconded by Councilor Brendlinger. The clerk called the roll with the following results:

Motion carried; the bid for the water treatment plant and water intake upgrades to E.M.K. Construction at a total cost of \$177,600.

3. Request to increase lien search fees from \$3.50 to \$5.50

Staff requested that council approve an increase in lien search fees from \$3.50 to \$5.50 for each lien search. Staff pointed out that the fee of \$3.50 has been charged for several years and does not cover the cost of performing a lien search. Most other entities have increased the fee to \$5.50, although \$5.50 still does not cover the cost of performing a lien search. It was pointed out by City Attorney Mike Gillespie that some cities have gone to a \$10.00 fee.

Councilor Curry moved to approve an increase in lien search fees from \$3.50 to \$7.50 for each lien search, which motion was seconded by Councilor Brimm. The clerk called the roll with the following results:

4. DEQ Stipulated and Final Order - No. WQ-SWR-92-42

City Manager Dennis Cluff advised that the new NPDES permit and the interim discharge standards we are receiving are tied to certain conditions or stipulations identified in the attached pages. Basically, the city must build the sludge lagoon and make the treatment plant improvements needed to work the sludge under a timetable located on page 3 of the attached document.

If the city fails to achieve the construction timetable our NPDES permit will revert to a stricter version proposed earlier by DEQ. If the city fails to sign the Stipulated and Final Order our NPDES permit will revert to the same stricter mass loadings.

Councilor Davis moved to authorize the Mayor to sign the DEQ Stipulated and Final Order, which motion was seconded by Councilor Brendlinger. The clerk called the roll with the following results:

Motion carried; mayor authorized to sign the DEQ Stipulated and Final Order.

E. Contract Review Board

Councilor Brimm disqualified herself from participating in the discussion and decision on this matter due to family ties, and stepped down from the bench.

- 1. Resolution No. 92-R-531 - A resolution of the City of Brookings Local Contract Review Board exempting from competitive bidding requirements the disposal of surplus property (1967 GMC truck tractor).**

The city negotiated with the property owner on Old County Road for some additional right-of-way in exchange for the old fire tractor. The city is receiving 6,842 square feet of right-of-way in exchange for this old vehicle. In order to execute the exchange instead of competitive bidding, this resolution needs to be adopted.

Mayor Hummel convened a Contract Review Board.

Councilor Davis moved to adopt Resolution No. 92-R-531, which motion was seconded by Councilor Brendlinger. The clerk called the roll with the following results:

Councilor Curry moved to accept the right-of-way deed - Old County Road from Bateman, which motion was seconded by Councilor Davis. The clerk called the roll with the following results:

Motion carried; right-of-way deed for Old County Road from Bateman, accepted.

1. Request to remove trees on Spruce Street - Betsy Bubble Bath, Inc., Ken Barton, President - Councilor Davis

At the February 24, 1992 Council meeting, the city council voted to send the request from Ken Barton, President of Betsy Bubble Bath, Inc., to remove trees on Spruce Street which block the view of his carwash sign, to the Parks and Recreation Commission at their February 26, 1992 meeting, for a recommendation. Councilor Davis stated that he would attend that meeting and would bring the recommendation back to the city council at their March 9, 1992 meeting.

City Attorney Mike Gillespie suggested that the city contact the owner of the property which abuts the property where the trees are growing, to ascertain his wishes. He pointed out that the owner of the abutting property has some rights pertaining to trees abutting his property.

Councilor Davis moved to table the issue of the request to remove trees on Spruce Street until the owner of the abutting property was contacted, which motion was seconded by Councilor Curry. The clerk called the roll with the following results:

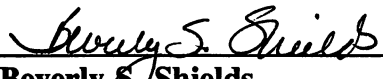
Councilor Davis moved to adjourn, which motion was seconded by Councilor Curry; motion carried unanimously.
