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NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED AIR QUALITY RULE AMENDMENTS

The Oregon Department of Environmental Quality is proposing that the Environmental Quality Commission adopt rules that incorporate Lane Regional Air Protection Agency rules into OAR 340-200-0040 as part of Oregon's State Implementation Plan. This includes LRAPA rules for open burning, permit streamlining, and permitting requirements for PM2.5 and greenhouse gases including new source review and prevention of significant deterioration, as well as national emission standards for hazardous air pollutants. These amendments, if adopted, will be submitted to the US Environmental Protection Agency for approval and as a revision to the State Implementation Plan, as required by the Clean Air Act.

DEQ will hold a public hearing on the proposed rule changes on January 22, 2014 at 5:30 p.m. at 1010 Main Street, Springfield, Oregon 97477. Oral and written comments will be accepted at the hearing. There are three rulemaking packages. Robert Paul, Sandy High school's longtime wrestling coach, died Friday after a 10-month battle with melanoma. He was 49.

Willamette Valley/Metro: Fish and wildlife statistics show a dramatic decrease in angler effort and success in the gorge fishery. Foraging stellar sea lions have changed the behavior of fish in the gorge, but the shift to the Willamette has paid dividends for anglers working that water.

Anglers are catching a steelhead or two every other day at Meldrum Bar on the lower Willamette River. After the next big rain and the river gets a bump

still struggling to find reason to pursue early run steelhead on the north coast. The signature system, the North Fork Nehalem has yet to produce any measurable catches at the hatchery, although water conditions certainly haven't helped. Any rise in river levels will stimulate a bite. Big and Gnat Creek, the Klaskanine, Necanicum, Kilchis and Three Rivers are all options but none are producing banner early returns of steelhead. 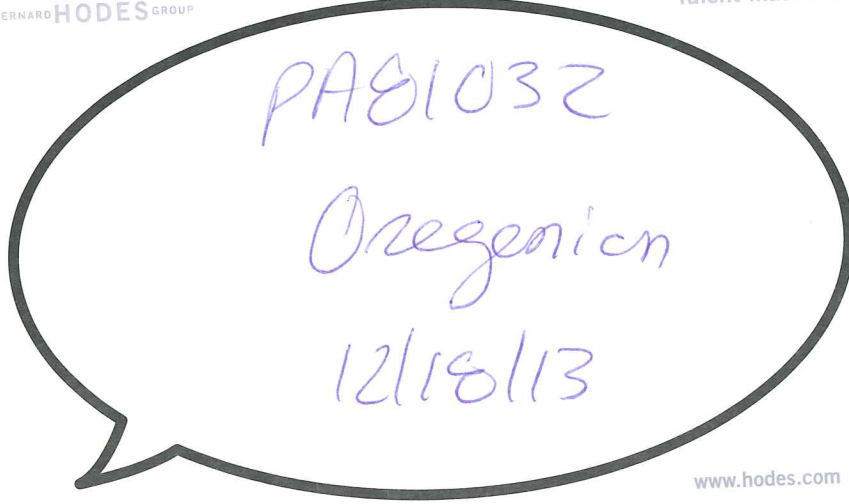
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
