Allocation of Connections

The Department has evaluated the proposal submitted by the Unified Sewerage Agency and concludes that the proposed program is a reasonable alternative to the monthly quota system originally proposed by the Department in Medford on July 26, 1973. The USA proposal will permit allocation of 2/3 of the remaining treatment plant capacity during the next year. Allocation of connections beyond that point will be subject to reevaluation of remaining plant capacity.

## Director's Recommendations

It is recommended that connection quotas be established as follows for the period ending August 1, 1974:

Commitment of connections within these quotas shall be subject to the following conditions:

 If any treatment plant fails to perform in compliance with permit limits, commitment of additional connections to such plant may be terminated until compliance is restored. 2. In addition to monthly plant performance monitoring reports required by permit conditions, a report shall be submitted at the end of each calendar month containing the following information for each plant:

Number of single family unit equivalents served.

Number of SFU equivalents committed during the month including a listing identifying individual commitments.

Total number of SFU equivalents committed but not yet served.

It is further recommended that the Department be authorized to establish and implement quotas for the Tualatin and King City plants to insure that such plants do not become overloaded and continue to perform in compliance with permit limits.
