SUBJECT: Material for Monday 12/3/90 Special Meeting

In light of the passage of Measure 5, each state agency has been asked by the Executive Department to provide General Fund reduction options for 1991-93. Specifically, the reduction must equal ten percent (10%) of the Executive Department's Analyst Recommended Budget. The total dollar amount of such a reduction is \$2.4 Million. Currently, we are also being asked by the Legislative Fiscal Office to provide options for a slightly deeper reduction of \$2.8 Million.

Enclosed are 3 items for discussion at the meeting on Monday.

<u>Item 1:</u> The dollar amount of a five, ten, and fifteen percent reduction in General Fund from the Analyst's Recommended Budget. This list is organized by program area.

Item 2: A list of reduction options that the Department has determined to be most reasonable.

Item 3: A letter submitted to the Executive Department describing our candidates for a 10% reduction from the Analyst's Recommended Budget.

Mike Dear Mr. Marsh,

In response to your request for a 10% cut in General Fund from the Analyst's Recommended Budget, below are the candidates the Department believes are most reasonable. The analyst recommended \$24,370,340 of general fund dollars for the 1991-93 biennium. A 10% cut would equal \$2,437,034. The concepts below total \$2,439,711.

Concept 1

Replace general fund monies for the Illegal Drug Lab Cleanup program with other fund dollars. The 1991-93 General Fund savings would be \$1,339,461.

Potential funding for the program may come from alternatives such as the use of the new 1991 Anti-Drug Abuse federal funds, the Hazardous Substance Possession fee, local cost share and cost recovery. If additional funding is necessary, the potential also exists to use the Hazardous Substance and Remedial Action Fund especially if a drug lab poses extreme environmental threat.

Concept 2

Defer general fund monies for the Sewer Safety program. The 1991-93 General Fund savings would total \$1,040,250.

This program could be accomplished via the Pollution Control Bond Fund (PCBF). Bond proceeds have been used in the past for this program which provides loans to low income house owners to pay their sewer assessment charge. In the first year of the biennium, loans can be made from bond proceeds already within the PCBF. Any additional loans needed could then come from new bond issues in the second year. During 1991-93, any debt service needed for such an issuance would be made out of the Department's existing sinking fund, not the General Fund.

Concept 3

Eliminate a portion of the Noise program in the Air Quality division. The 1991-93 General Fund savings would be 60,000.
