BROOKINGS PLANNING COMMISSION MINUTES August 6, 2019

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Brookings Planning Commission was called to order by Chair Wulkowicz at 7:03 pm in the Council Chambers at Brookings City Hall followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

4.1 In the matter of File No. CUP-5-19, a request for approval of a Conditional Use Permit to operate a Short Term Rental facility at 96335 Dawson Road.

There was no ex parte contact, bias, personal interest, or conflicts of interest declared and no objection to the jurisdiction of the Planning Commission to hear the matter. The public hearing was opened at 7:07 pm. PWDS Director Tony Baron reviewed the staff report.

The applicant's property manager Holly Hatch of Paragon Properties explained as property manager her business is available to contact any time if neighbors have concerns about vacation rental tenants and that they would only be parking on the parcel property.

Denise Ortega, 96511 West Cliff Drive, Brookings, expressed concern about a short term rental in the neighborhood of owner occupied homes.

Marko Torsen, 96507 West Cliff Drive, Brookings, expressed concern that the property was bought by a large out of the area corporation and being turned into a short term rental, limiting an already small rental market for residents. He was also concerned with the turnover of short term visitors in the neighborhood and that they typically don't respect property access to the beach and use private easements.

Debbie Gleason, 17192 S. Passley, Brookings, expressed concern about another short term rental changing the nature of the neighborhood and opposed.

Bob Huntoon, 96436 Ocean Park Drive, expressed concern that the traffic will increase and renters will use the private beach access for Chetco Terrace.

Applicants Julie & Joe Montoya, 1326 Susan Circle, Roseville, CA clarified that they are not a large corporation but incorporated their small business for financial purposes. They purchased the property with the intent to retire here in three years, have engaged with the neighbors and made substantial improvements to the property. They do have deeded beach access, housekeepers and landscapers who will be maintaining the property.

No participant requested additional time to submit materials. The public hearing was closed at 7:33 pm.

The Commission discussed criteria required for a CUP and deliberated on the matter. As the home is on a flag lot Chair Wulkowicz requested that the address be posted at the driveway entrance. Motion made by Chair Wulkowicz to authorize a Conditional Use Permit to operate a Short Term Rental facility at 96335 Dawson Road, a .46 acre parcel located on Assessor's Map No. 40-14-36BC; Tax Lot 00200, zoned R-1-6, based on the findings and conclusions stated in the staff report and subject to the Conditions of Approval with Condition of Approval #13 be amended and that the address be visible and posted at the driveway entrance on Dawson Road; motion seconded by Commissioner Hunter. By a 6-0 vote the motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Malmberg to approve the Final Order with modification of Condition of Approval #13 that the address be visible and posted at the driveway entrance on Dawson Road; motion seconded by Commissioner Hartzell. By a 6-0 vote the motion carried.

REPORT FROM THE PLANNING STAFF – Tony Baron provided an update on the number of CUP Short Term Rentals (STR) advising that there are currently 22 active STRs, five B & B/Home Occupation Permits, and three inactive CUP's. The number is not as high as perceived.

Discussed beach access issues for neighborhoods with deeded beach access and how to control people who use the easements illegally. Suggested signs with strong wording including trespassing language to discourage use.



Purchase of Automated Meter Reading (AMR) system.

Recommended Motion:

Motion to authorize the City Manager to execute agreement with Ferguson Waterworks to purchase the Automated Meter Reading (AMR) system for a total of \$375,000.

Financial Impact:

The cost of purchasing this equipment is \$375,000, and was budgeted in the Water Fund and the Water System Replacement Fund.

Background/Discussion:

The Budget Committee and City Council discussed converting to smart meters multiple times over the last couple of years. The budget that was adopted for 2019-20 included funds to complete the first phase of the "smart meter" process.

The attached quote for Automated Meter Reading (AMR) includes "single port" and "double port" radios for all existing meters, the complete drive by package, and installation and training for that drive by package. Once this phase is complete, we will be able to read all meters in approximately one hour, compared to two weeks.

With cost savings from a decrease in staffing of a half-time position, we estimate that it will be a 7 to 8 year "return on investment". These radios are covered by a 15-year "bumper to bumper" warranty, and an additional five years prorated.

Ferguson is a sole source supplier of Sensus equipment, which is the manufacturer of current City meters. We will not be replacing meters, only inserting the "smart" radio into current meters.

In future years, we will look further into the second phase, Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI). We will be able to easily upgrade from AMR to AMI, with Sensus' fixed-base FlexNet communication network.

This network ensures:

- Accurate data measurement
- Consistent billing and faster billing resolution
- Support for multiple Sensus applications including Leak Detection, Pressure Regulation, Distribution Automation, Demand Response, temperature monitoring, etc.
- Scalability to grow with your needs
- Operational efficiency through advanced data analytics

The current estimate for completing the second phase to AMI is at an additional \$245,555. This could be phased in over multiple years.

A Vehicle Transceiver Unit (VXU) is required for dual reading capability.

The Vehicle Gateway Base Station (VGB) is a portable radiobased device used for the acquisition of data from utility meters and other field-based diagnostic instruments. The VGB is compact and portable, allowing it to be used in any vehicle providing 12-volt DC power.

Ease of Operation

To operate the VGB, the user simply places the unit in a vehicle cabin, loads the desired meter reading route into a laptop computer and drives along the prescribed route. Meter data is collected as the vehicle travels within proximity of meters and other instruments on the route.

The VGB sends an alert signal to the meter's SmartPoint® module or ancillary device. Upon receipt of the alert, the SmartPoint module responds by transmitting its most recent reading. Once received, the SmartPoint module returns to a low-power listening mode. The operator sends out a signal and connects to all SmartPoint modules within range.

Portability

Through the use of advanced design, the radio electronics of the VGB are contained in a portable enclosure about the size of a small briefcase. With the addition of a laptop computer, connecting cables and antenna, the complete VGB package can be set up in any vehicle within minutes. The portable VGB instantly turns almost any vehicle—even a compact car—into a meter reading machine.

System Reliability

The FlexNet® communication network and RadioRead+ utilize primary-use radio frequencies to communicate with SmartPoint modules. The combination of FCC-protected frequencies and shear transmission power of the SmartPoint modules ensure reliable communication from meters and ancillary devices. In addition, SmartPoint M2 and RadioRead+ modules provide infrastructure detail by monitoring their operating conditions and reporting meter tamper, continuous flow, leak detection (when equipped), high or low consumption and low battery alarms.

The VGB Model 4600 provides the ability to read both Sensus RadioRead and FlexNet drive-by technologies. By combining these technologies, this solution allows the utility to maintain and utilize their existing RadioRead system and reading equipment while transitioning to FlexNet. Dual reading capability allows the utility to transition to the latest FlexNet technology and positions utilities to migrate to a fixed base platform in the future.

User Friendly Software

The VGB utilizes AutoVu®, a software program designed for operating Sensus drive-by meter reading equipment. AutoVu features a convenient, user-friendly pull-down menu system for directing the meter reading process. Operators are also able to input information, such as route notes, manually via the PC's keyboards. The operator can easily edit route data configurations when necessary. The mapping feature allows the operator to add further efficiency by customizing the meter reader view to relevant meter reading process information. Back at the office, Sensus AutoRead® processes the information gathered by AutoVu and provide the utility's billing software with a simple plug-and-play interface, no matter what Sensus reading system is utilized.
