

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING THAT ALL BUILDINGS BOTH RESIDENCE AND BUSINESS BUILDINGS IN THE CITY OF WARRENTON AND TO BE CONSTRUCTED IN THE CITY OF WARRENTON SHALL BE PROVIDED WITH BRICK, CEMENT OR STONE CHIMNEYS, IN ORDER TO PROTECT THE HEALTH AND SAFETY OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS

SECTION -1-

That wherever stove-pipes are now extending through openings in the roofs, ceilings or sides of any building in the City of Warrenton, the same is hereby declared a nuisance and a menace to the protection and safety of the general public, and the owners thereof are hereby directed to replace the same with brick, cement or stone chimneys within sixty (60) days after the passage of this Ordinance.

SECTION -2-

All buildings hereafter constructed or now in the course of construction shall have chimneys of either brick, cement or stone.

SECTION -3-

Any violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed a mis-deamnor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined a sum not exceeding three hundred Dollars (\$300.00) or by imprisonment in the City Jail, for 100 days.

SECTION -4-

Inasmuch as the objects to be obtained from this Ordinance will be of great benefit to the people of the City of Warrenton and there exists and is an urgent necessity that this Ordinance should take effect as soon as possible so that the health, peace and safety of the people of the City of Warrenton may be preserved an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Section therefore shall take effect when approved by the unanimous vote of the Commission present and not less than three (3) members thereof, and this Ordinance shall then be in full force and operative immediately

after its passage and approval by the Mayor of the City of
Warrenton.
