

ORD # 116

An ordinance appropriating the sum of one hundred dollars as a rebate on the saloon license of Jacob Bosshart:

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Whereas, Jacob Bosshart in making application to re-  
new his liquor license gave notice that he would not renew the  
same unless the license was reduced to four hundred dollars, and

Whereas, at that time it was agreed between the Common  
Council of the City of Warrenton and said Jacob Bosshart that if  
he would pay to the Treasurer with his application, five hundred  
dollars, that a rebate of one hundred dollars would be allowed  
him on account of said license; therefore the city of Warrenton  
does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. That there be and is hereby appropriated out  
of the general fund for the benefit of Jacob Bosshart, the sum of  
one hundred dollars as a rebate upon his liquor license extending  
from the 3 day of March, 1914, to the 3  
day of March, 1915, and upon the  
passage and approval of this ordinance a warrant shall be drawn  
in favor of said Jacob Bosshart for said sum.
