

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF WHEELER STREET FROM A POINT TEN FEET SOUTH OF THE NORTH LINE OF ALBANY AVENUE TO THE NORTH LINE OF SPOKANE AVENUE IN THE FIRST EXTENSION TO EAST WARRENTON.

WHEREAS, The Common Council duly adopted a resolution on the 20th day of July, 1914, declaring its intention to improve Wheeler Street, as hereinafter particularly described, said resolution being in all respects in compliance with the provisions of the Charter of the City of Warrenton, and the estimates and specifications for said improvement having been deposited with the Auditor and Police Judge, and notice of the Council's intention to make such improvement having been duly posted, proof of such posting being now on file with the Auditor and Police Judge, and the time for filing remonstrances against said improvement having expired and no remonstrance having been filed against same, therefore:

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the following described portion of Wheeler Street, to-wit:

Beginning at a point ten (10) feet south of the north line of Albany Avenue, thence along said Wheeler Street to the north line of Spokane Avenue in the First Extension of East Warrenton as laid out and platted by P. C. and F. M. Warren and others, excepting from the aforementioned portion of said Wheeler Street the space of sixty (60) feet across the right of way of the S. P. & S. Ry. Co., all of said property being in the City of Warrenton, Clatsop County, Oregon;

shall be improved for the width of forty (40) feet along the center of said Wheeler Street, by grading, leveling and draining the same, the center of the street to be the highest portion thereof, with a gentle slope on each side of the center line to the outer edge of each side of said 40-foot strip, and said Wheeler street shall be drained by one culvert, to be constructed of good, sound fir lumber four inches in thickness, such culvert to be placed thru and under said street at a point where it will be most serviceable in the matter of draining the same, the size of said culvert to be twelve inches high by eighteen inches wide, inside

measurements, and it shall be 36 feet long. Said improvement shall be completed by the 1st day of February 1914.

Section 2. The contract for said improvement shall be let to the lowest responsible bidder, and the Committee on Streets and Public Ways is hereby authorized and directed to receive sealed bids for said improvement; to enter into and execute a contract on behalf of the City of Warrenton with the lowest responsible bidder thereon; to inspect the improvement and to see that it is done in accordance with the contract and the plans and specifications, and to advertise for bids for said improvement by posting notices at three public places in the City of Warrenton for a period of Two weeks immediately preceding the time of letting the contract for said improvement. Said notices shall describe the improvement, state the terms of payment therefor, when and where the bids will be received and opened, and reserve the right to reject any and all bids.
