

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE KEEPING OF PIGS AND (OR) HOGS IN ANY ENCLOSURE WITHIN THREE-HUNDRED (300) FEET OF ANY DWELLING-HOUSE AND OR PLACE USED AS A DWELLING, RESTAURANT, HOTEL AND (OR) PLACE OF BUSINESS, DECLARING THE SAME A NUISANCE, PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF SAME AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION-1-

It shall be unlawful for any person and (or) persons, firm or corporation to keep within the Corporate Limits of the City of Warrenton any pigs and (or) hogs in any enclosure within three-hundred (300) feet of any dwelling-house or place occupied as a dwelling-house, restaurant, hotel and (or) place of business.

SECTION-2-

It shall be unlawful for any person and (or) persons, firm or corporation to permit any pigs and (or) hogs to run at large within the Corporate Limits of the City of Warrenton.

SECTION-3-

Any violation of this Ordinance shall be deemed as mis-demanner and upon conviction thereof before the Auditor and Police Judge of the City of Warrenton shall be fined in a sum not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) nor more than Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) or by imprisonment in the City Jail not more than One Hundred (100) days.

SECTION-4-

Any Ordinance or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

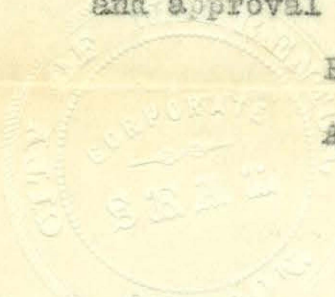
SECTION -5-

Inasmuch as the objects to be obtained from this Ordinance will be of great benefit to the people of the City of Warrenton and there exists and is an urgent necessity that this Ordinance shall

take effect as soon as possible sothat the health, peace and safety of the people of the City of Warrenton may be preserved, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Section therefor shall take effect when approved by the unanimous vote of the Commission present and not less than three (3) members thereof and this Ordinance shall then be in full force and operative immediately after its passage and approval by the Mayor of the City of Warrenton.
