

Ordinance No. 89

An Ordinance providing for the drawing of two warrants in the sum of Six Hundred Dollars (\$600) each - one payable July 2nd 1913 and one payable July 2nd 1914 both bearing interest @ 8% per an. said interest to be payable quarterly.

The City of Warrenton does ordain as follows.

Section 1. That the Mayor and Auditor &

Police Judge be and they are hereby authorized and directed to draw two warrants in the

sum of Six Hundred Dollars (\$600) each

payable to W. H. and Anna. M. Coffey

one of said warrants to be payable July 2nd 1913

and the other to be payable July 2nd 1914.

Said warrants to draw interest @ 8% per an.

payable quarterly.

Section 2. That said Warrants are drawn for

the purpose of raising funds for building a City Hall for said City.

Section 3. That upon on the receipt of

the sum of Twelve Hundred Dollars (\$1,200⁰⁰)

from W. H. Anna. M. Coffey that said Warrant

shall be delivered to said parties and the

Auditor & Police Judge of said City be and is

hereby directed upon receipt of said money

to deliver the same to the Treasurer of the
City of Warrenton taking his receipt therefor.
Section 4. That it is desirable that said
City Hall be & should be kept during the
dry season of the summer months and
before October 15th 1912. and in order therefore
to preserve the Health, Peace & Safety of
the people of the City of Warrenton and
emergency is hereby declared to exist and
this Ordinance shall go into immediate
effect when it shall be approved by three
fifths of the Councilmen of the City of
Warrenton and when passed by the
Common Council and approved by the Mayor

Passed the Common Council the second
day of July 1912.
