

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF A PORTION OF PACIFIC STREET BY DIGGING A DRAIN, GUTTER, OR DITCH ALONG THE WEST SIDE OF THE SAME.

WHEREAS, due and regular notice of the election and intention of the Common Council to improve Pacific Street by digging a drain, gutter or ditch along a portion of the west side thereof, in accordance with a resolution duly adopted by the Council on the 21st day of December, 1914, and from the proof of publication of said Council's intention to improve said street, now on file with the Auditor and Police Judge, and the Committee on Streets and Public Ways having made and filed estimates of the cost of constructing said improvement, together with specifications for the same, and no remonstrance having been filed against said improvement, and the time for filing such remonstrance having elapsed, therefore,

THE CITY OF WARRENTON ORDINANS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That said Pacific Street shall be improved by digging and excavating a drain, gutter or ditch, averaging 32 inches in depth and 42 inches in width, along the west side of that portion of said Pacific Street described as follows: Beginning at the ditch or drain in the old county road or highway, going west to Ocean View Cemetery, at Block 7 in Skipsnon Addition to Astoria in Warrenton, to the ditch running east and west on the north side of the F. W. Preston property, such improvement being approximately 702 feet in length.

Section 2. That said Committee be, and the same hereby is, authorized and directed to advertise for bids for the construction of said improvement by posting notices in three conspicuous places within said city for a period of ten successive days, to receive bids for said improvement and to report the same to the Council and, upon the acceptance of the lowest bid by the Council, to enter into a contract with such bidder for the purpose of making the improvement.

The contract shall provide that said improvement shall be constructed and completed to the satisfaction of said Committee, and that such improvement shall be completed on or before the 1st day of April

1915, unless the time be extended by ordinance, and for each day's delay in the completion of said improvement, unless the time is extended as aforesaid, the contractor shall forfeit and pay to the City of Warrenton,

as liquidated damages for such delay, the sum of \$ 250; that said improvement shall be made strictly in accordance with said plans and specifications and this ordinance, and the contractor shall have full charge of the work and shall be responsible for all accidents and injuries occurring upon the portion of said street being improved as aforesaid, during the progress of the work thereon, and shall save the City of Warrenton harmless from all damages on account of injury or injuries to any person or persons occurring upon the said portion of said Pacific Street while said improvement is being made.

That payments for said improvement shall be made in warrants of the City of Warrenton, upon a special fund constituted to defray the cost of the improvement, or upon the general fund, or partly upon each fund, and that payment be made ^{in said warrants} within ninety (90) days from the time the improvement shall be accepted by the City of Warrenton.

The contractors shall be required to give bond with two or more sureties in the sum of \$ 40.00, condition for the faithful performance of said contract.

Section 3. That the Committee on Streets and Public Ways is hereby authorized and directed to make and levy, in pursuance of Section 51 of the charter, as amended in 1901, a special assessment for the purpose of paying for said improvement, upon the real property abutting thereon, particularly described as follows, to-wit: Lots numbered 1 to 14, both inclusive, in Block 7 of Skipanon Addition to Astoria, in the City of Warrenton.

That the aggregate sum to be assessed against said property shall be ~~\$~~ determined by said Committee.

and That said Committee shall make said levy and assessment and report the same to the Council as soon as practicable.
