

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE DIGGING OF A DRAIN OR DITCH ABOUT 861 FEET IN LENGTH ALONG A PORTION OF FIRST STREET IN WARREN'S SECOND ~~EXTENSION~~ TO WARRENTON AND TO CONSTRUCT A TIDE BOX THEREFOR Extension.

WHEREAS, due regular notice of the election and intention of the Common Council of the City of Warrenton to dig and construct a ditch along a portion of First Street in Warren's second Extension to Warrenton, in accordance with a resolution duly adopted by said Council on

the 1st day of February, 1915, and it appearing to the Council from the proof of publication of the Council's intention to make said improvement now on file with the Auditor and Police Judge, and ~~xxxxxx~~ certified to as being placed on file January 20th, 1915, by F. G. Morss, having made and filed estimates

of the cost of constructing said improvement, together with specifications for the same, in accordance with said resolution and no remonstrance having been filed against said improvement and the time for filing such having elapsed, therefore,

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That a ditch or drain be dug and constructed of the size and along the course described as follows: The same to be 18 inches wide at bottom, with each side sloping upward and outward at a slope of  $\frac{1}{2}$  to 1; depth thereof to vary in depth from 1 foot 8 inches to 3 feet 8 inches, according to the contour of the earth, with a maximum grade of .01% per cent.

all in accordance with plans and specifications heretofore filed with the Auditor and Police Judge, and said ditch or drain shall be 861 feet over and along the following described course: beginning at a point in First Street in Warren's second extension to Warrenton, where the same is intersected by the East bank of Alder Slough, running thence along said street parallel to the North boundary line thereof and 15 feet South of such line, and South of blocks 109, 110, 111, and the West one-half of block No. 112, all being in said extension, Extension.

Section 2. That a suitable wood tide box or tide gate be constructed and placed at the lower end or entrance of said ditch or drain, and that the same be in accordance with said plans and specifications.

Section 3. That the Committee on Streets and Public Ways be, and it hereby is, authorized and instructed to advertise for bids for the construction of said improvement as follows:

by one insertion in the "Warrenton News";

and to receive bids for said improvement and to report the same to the Council, and upon the acceptance of the bid of the lowest responsible bidder by the Council, to enter into a contract with such bidder for the construction of said improvement.

Section 4. The contract with said bidder shall provide that said improvement shall be constructed and completed to the satisfaction of said committee, and that such improvement shall be completed on or before the 12<sup>th</sup> day of May, 1915, unless the time be extended by ordinance, and for each day's delay in the completion of said improvement, unless the time be extended, as aforesaid, the contractor shall forfeit and pay to the City of Warrenton, as stipulated damages for such delay, the sum of \$250; that said improvement shall be made strictly in accordance with said plans and specifications and this ordinance, and the contractor shall have full charge of the work and shall be responsible for accidents and injuries occurring on that portion of First Street, along which said improvement extends, and to save the City of Warrenton harmless from all damages on account of injury or injuries to any person or persons happening upon the said portion of the street aforesaid, while the improvement is being made.

Section 5. The contractor or contractors shall be required to give bond with two or more sureties in the sum of \$500, conditioned for the faithful performance of said contract.

Section 6. That said improvement shall be paid for in warrants of the City of Warrenton, drawn upon a special fund, created and constituted as hereinafter set forth, and that payment be made within 90 days from the time the improvement shall be accepted.

Section 7. That the Committee on Streets and Public Ways is hereby authorized and directed to make and levy, in pursuance of Section 51 of the Charter, as amended in 1901, a special assessment for the purpose of paying for said improvement, upon the following described property, to-wit:

Lots 9,&10.in Block 112, Lots 7.8.9.&10.in Block 111. Lots 7.8.9.&10.  
in Block 110. Lots 7.8.9.&10. in Block 109.  
Lots 15&16,in Block 125. Lots 1.2.15&16.in Block 126.Lots 1.2.15&16.  
in Block 127. Lots 1.2.15.&16,in Block 128. All of said lots being in  
Warren's Second extension to Warrenton. Oregon.
