

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A RETAIL LIQUOR LICENSE TO C. J. Belcher.

and D. Murphy, AN DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, it appears to the Common Council that C. J. Belcher and Dan Murphy ~~have~~ <sup>partners doing business as Belcher & Murphy.</sup> filed an application and petition for a liquor license and given notice of making such application, in accordance with the charter and ordinance of the City, and that no protest against the granting of said application and petition has been filed, and the time for filing such protest having elapsed; and

WHEREAS, the electorate of the State of Oregon, at the general election held November 3, 1914, amended Article 1 of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, by adding a section numbered 36 thereto, which amendment prohibits, after January 1, 1916, the manufacture or sale of intoxicating liquors within the State of Oregon, except for medicinal, scientific, sacramental, and mechanical purposes, said amendment having thereafter been made effective by the proclamation of the Governor of Oregon; now therefore,

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That a license be, and it hereby is, granted and directed to issue to Belcher & Murphy licensing and granting them permission to sell, give away, and barter, malt, spirituous, vinous, and other intoxicating liquors in the building located on the land described as follows, to-wit:

on the South-east corner of Block 10. (numbered on the city maps Lot 24) of Flavel in Warrenton.

Section 2. That said license shall be issued for the period from June 12th, 1915, to December 31, 1915, both dates inclusive. That said Belcher & Murphy, shall pay a license fee of \$ 276.03, for said license.

Section 3. That prior to the issuance of said license, said Belcher & Murphy, shall execute and deliver to the City of Warrenton, with sufficient sureties, a bond in accordance with the requirements of Section 3 of Ordinance No. 6, approved February 27, 1899.

Section 4. That the passage of this ordinance at this time and the taking effect of same forthwith is necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Warrenton, and an emergency is therefore hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
