

ORDINANCE NO. 153^a

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES OF ELECTIVE AND APPOINTIVE OFFICERS OF THE CITY OF WARRENTON, SAID SALARIES TO BECOME EFFECTIVE AS OF AUGUST 1, 1932, AND CONTINUE THEREAFTER

WHEREAS, The City of Warrenton now has various elective officers and appointive officers and employes receiving fixed salaries; and,

WHEREAS, Under the present financial condition, due to the large amount of delinquent taxes on property lying within the boundary lines of the City of Warrenton, it is utterly impossible for the City of Warrenton to maintain its present wage scale; and,

WHEREAS, In order to relieve the taxpayers of the City of Warrenton of part of its obligation as far as the operating expense of the city is concerned,

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the salaries of all elective and appointive officers and employes of the City of Warrenton from and after the 1st day of August, 1932, and thereafter until otherwise ordered, shall be as follows, to-wit:

City Auditor and Police Judge \$ 120⁰⁰ per month
City Attorney \$ 75⁰⁰ per month
Dyke Superintendent \$ 120⁰⁰ per month
Water Superintendent \$ 120⁰⁰ per month
Assistant Water Superintendent \$ 90⁰⁰ per month
Chief of Police \$ 50⁰⁰ per month
Fire Chief \$ 12⁰⁰ per month
City Manager shall receive \$ 5⁰⁰ per diem for each day while actively engaged in city business
City Commissioners shall receive \$ 4⁰⁰ per meeting for attending each Commissioners ^(regular) meeting.

Section 2. Payment of the above salaries shall be made out of the funds as heretofore provided and in the same manner as salaries have been paid in the past.
