

ORDINANCE NO 155

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1 OF ORDINANCE NO. 56, AND SECTION 6 OF ORDINANCE NO. 117.

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

That Section 1 of Ordinance No.56, be, and the same hereby is, amended so as to read as follows:

Section 1. The Auditor and Police Judge shall give ten days notice of all general elections, designating therein the officers to be elected, and the place or places of holding the election. Such notice may be given by posting the same in three public and conspicuous places in the City for a period of ten days, or by publication thereof in two ^{successive} weekly issues, published at least once each week, and generally circulated, in the City.

That Section 6 of Ordinance 117, approved May 21, 1914, be, and the same hereby is, hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 6. Immediately upon the filing of any such petition for the referendum or initiative with the Auditor and Police Judge of the City of Warrenton, signed by the number of voters and filed within the time required by this ordinance, he shall cause notice thereof, announcing that such petition has been filed, with a brief statement of its tenor and effect, to be given by publication in two successive weekly issues of a weekly newspaper of general circulation in the City of Warrenton, and by posting a copy of such notice in four public places in the City of Warrenton.
