

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE TIME AND PLACE OF THE MEETING OF THE COMMON COUNCIL, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That after this date, the time and place of the meeting of the Common Council shall be, respectively, as follows: The time shall be the hour of 7:30 O'clock P.M. on the first Monday of each month; provided that when such Monday shall be a legal holiday or a non-judicial day throughout the State of Oregon, the meeting shall be held at the same hour on the next succeeding judicial day; the place of meeting shall be in the City Hall of the City of Warrenton.

Section 2. In addition to the meetings provided for in Section 1 above, the Council may always adjourn from time to time, and it may always meet at the call of the Mayor upon the Auditor and Police Judge notifying each of the Councilmen, in writing, at least twenty-four hours preceding the time of any desired meeting other than said stated meetings; or it may meet without such notice being first given, provided the notice shall be waived by the Councilmen, and such notice shall be deemed to have been waived unless the Councilmen or Councilman desiring to protest, shall do so within twenty-four hours of receiving notice or knowledge that the meeting was held.

Section 3. That any and all business and proceedings may be done and transacted by the Council as effectively as though the same were done and transacted at a regular, stated meeting, whether such meeting be a special or regular meeting.

Section 4. That the passage of this ordinance at this time, and the taking effect of it forthwith, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the Public Peace, Health and Safety of the inhabitants of the City of Warrenton, and, therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage by the Council, and approval by the Mayor.
