

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF SIXTH STREET IN WARRENTON ADDITION TO ASTORIA FROM THE WEST EDGE OF ~~THE MACADAM ON~~ MAIN STREET TO THE CENTER LINE OF CEDAR STREET, BY LAYING AND CONSTRUCTING A SOLID PLANK SURFACE, 3 INCHES THICK AND 9 FEET WIDE, ALONG THE CENTER THEREOF, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, due and regular notice of the election and intention of the Common Council to improve Sixth Street in Warrenton Addition to Astoria, in the City of Warrenton, from the west edge of ~~the macadam on~~ Main Street to the center of Cedar Street, by laying and constructing a solid plank surface, three inches thick by nine feet wide, along the center thereof, has been given, in accordance with a resolution adopted July 26, 1915, as appears from the proof of posting such notice, on file in the office of the Auditor and Police Judge, and the Committee on Streets and Public Ways having made and filed with the Auditor and Police Judge an estimate of the cost of constructing said improvement, together with specifications for the same, and no remonstrance having been filed against said improvement, as provided by the charter, and the time for the filing of such remonstrance having elapsed, therefore,

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That said Sixth Street be improved from the west edge of ~~the macadam on~~ Main Street to the center line of Cedar Street, by laying and constructing a solid plank surface, of good, sound fir lumber, three inches thick by nine feet long, along the center of said Sixth Street, all in accordance with said resolution, notice, and specifications.

Section 2. That said Committee on Streets and Public Ways be, and it hereby is, authorized and directed to advertise for bids for the construction of said improvement by posting notices or calls for bids in three conspicuous places within said City for a period of ten successive days, to receive bids for said improvement, and to report the same to the Council, and upon the acceptance of the bid of the lowest responsible bidder by the Council, to enter into a contract with such bidder for the construction of the improvement as aforesaid.

The contract shall provide that the said improvement shall be made and completed to the satisfaction of said Committee, and that such improvement shall be completed on or before the 7<sup>th</sup> day of October, 1915, unless the time be extended by ordinance, and for each day's delay in the completion of said improvement, unless the time be extended as aforesaid,

the contractor shall forfeit and pay to the City of Warrenton, as stipulated damages for such delay, the sum of \$ 250; that said improvement shall be made strictly in accordance with said plans and specifications and this ordinance, and the contractor shall have full charge of the work and shall be responsible for all accidents and injuries occurring upon said street during the progress of the work, and save the City of Warrenton harmless from all damages on account of injury or injuries to any person or persons occurring upon the said portion of said <sup>-th</sup> Six<sup>th</sup> Street while the improvement is being made as aforesaid.

Said improvement shall be paid for in warrants of the City of Warrenton, drawn upon a special fund constituted to defray the cost of the improvement, as hereinafter stated, and that payment for the improvement shall be made within 90 days from the time the improvement shall be accepted.

The contractor or contractors shall be required to give a bond, with two or more sufficient sureties, conditioned for the faithful performance of said contract.

Section 3. That the Committee on Streets and Public Ways is hereby authorized and directed to make and levy, in pursuance of the requirements of Section 51 of the Charter, as amended in 1901, a special assessment sufficient to pay, and for the purpose of paying, for said improvement, upon the real property abutting thereon, particularly described as follows:

Lots 8 and 9 in Block 16, and Lots 1 and 16 in Block 19, all of said property being in Warrenton Addition to Astoria, in Warrenton, Clatsop County, Oregon.

Section 4. That the passage of this ordinance at this time, and the taking effect thereof forthwith is necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Warrenton, and an emergency is, therefore, hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from such time for the further reason that it touches and affects only municipal business of the City of Warrenton, as contradistinguished from municipal legislation thereof.
