

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD DECEMBER 20, 1916; NAMING THE POLLING PLACE; DESIGNATING THE JUDGES AND THE CLERKS OF ELECTION; STATING DUTIES OF CERTAIN OFFICERS IN CONNECTION WITH THE ELECTION.

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That there shall be held a general election in the City of Warrenton, Oregon, on Wednesday, the 20th day of December, A.D. 1916, at which time certain officers hereinafter named shall be elected by the qualified voters of the City.

Section 2. That said election shall be held at, and the voting or polling place shall be in, the City Hall of said City of Warrenton.

Section 3. That the three following named persons be, and they hereby are, designated and appointed judges of said election: Emil Erickson M J Groh and John Bruce;

and if any of such judges shall fail to attend and serve at the proper time, the voters then present at the voting place may elect another, or others, accordingly as there shall be one or more of them absent, to serve in his, her or their place or places; and if either or both of the clerks of election hereinafter named shall fail to attend and serve at the proper time and place, the judges may appoint some elector, or electors, to serve in his, her or their place or places; and that the two following named persons be, and they hereby are, designated and appointed clerks of said election: James E Gault and

Harold G. Green; and the Auditor and Police Judge is hereby directed to notify said judges and said clerks of election, in writing, not later than ten days prior to the date of said election.

Section 4. That said election shall be by ballot, which shall be substantially in the form provided by law for use in State elections, being the form of ballot heretofore used at general city elections.

Section 5. That said election shall commence at 9 o'clock A. M. and close at 7 o'clock P. M. on the said 20th day of December, 1916, but the judges of election may, in their discretion, close the polls at noon for one hour.

Section 6. That the Auditor and Police Judge shall give ten days' notice of said election by posting typewritten or printed notices at three public places in said City of Warrenton, which shall plainly state the time and the place of the holding of said election, and designating the officers to be elected, with their respective terms, and giving the usual notice of any measures to be voted upon at the election.

Section 7. That on or before the second day immediately following said election, the return thereof must be filed with the said Auditor and Police Judge, whereupon he shall call to his assistance the Mayor of said City and they shall then canvass the returns of said election.

Section 8. Upon the completion of counting of the votes as aforesaid, the Auditor and Police Judge shall issue certificates of election to the successful candidates, respectively, the same to be under his hand and official seal, as such officer; and the original poll books and the returns must be filed with said Auditor and Police Judge in his office, to be by him preserved.

Section 9. That the passage of this ordinance and the taking effect of same immediately is necessary for the preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Warrenton, and an emergency is, therefore, hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Passed by the Council and Approved by the Mayor on November 20, 1916.
