

Ordinance number 148

An ordinance establishing the grade on Date street lying adjacent to O'Hara's Addition and West Warrenton Addition to the City of Warrenton, from the North line of the County Road, to the ~~west~~ North line of west seventh street.

WHEREAS:-

The common council of the city of Warrenton has declared its determination and intention to establish the grade on Date street ~~from~~ lying adjacent to O'Hara's Addition and West Warrenton Addition to the city of Warrenton, from the north line of the County Road to the the North line of west seventh street, and

WHEREAS due notice of the intention and determination of the said Council to establish said grade has been given by publication for ten days in the Warrenton News, and no remonstrance has been filed against the establishing of said grade; THEREFORE.

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS.

Section One. That the grade on Date street lying adjacent to O'Hara's Addition and West Warrenton Addition to the city of Warrenton, from the North line of the County Road to the North line of West seventh street, in the City of Warrenton be and the same is herewith established at the following elevation above the base of grades as follows, to-wit ;

At the North line of the County Road at its intersection with Date street at an elevation of 20 feet above the base of grades.

At the intersection of Date street with west eight street, at the north and also at the south line of said west eight street at an elevation of 23 feet above the base of grades.

At the intersection of Date street with west seventh street, at the north and also at the south line of said west seventh street at an elevation of 28 feet above the base of grades.

That between the points above designated the grade shall be upon an even and gradual slope.
