

ORDINANCE NO. 184 A

INTRODUCED BY COMMISSIONER H. E. Bowen.

AN ORDINANCE FORBIDDING SOLICITORS, PEDDLERS, HAWKERS, ITINERANT MERCHANTS AND TRANSIENT VENDORS OF MERCHANDISE, BOOKS, PICTURES AND/OR PERIODICALS FROM TRESPASSING IN AND UPON PRIVATE RESIDENCES, WHEN UNINVITED SO TO DO BY THE OWNERS OR OCCUPANTS OF SAID PRIVATE RESIDENCE, IN SOLICITING AND ATTEMPTING TO SOLICIT ORDERS OR IN SELLING AND EXPOSING FOR SALE WARES AND MERCHANDISE, PICTURES, BOOKS AND/OR PERIODICALS, AND DECLARING SUCH SOLICITING TO BE A NUISANCE AND DIRECTING THE POLICE AUTHORITIES TO ABATE SUCH NUISANCE, AND FIXING THE PENALTY FOR COMMITTING SUCH NUISANCE AND REPEALING ANY AND ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The practise of going in and upon private residences in the City of Warrenton, Oregon by solicitors, peddlers, Hawkers, itinerant merchants and transient vendors of merchandise, books, pictures and/or periodicals, not having been requested or invited so to do by the owner or owners or occupant or occupants of said private residences for the purpose of soliciting orders for the sale of goods, wares, merchandise, books, pictures and/or periodicals and/or for the purpose of disposing of and/or peddling or hawking any of such articles, is hereby declared to be a nuisance.

Section 2. The Chief of Police and police officers of the City of Warrenton, Oregon are hereby required and directed to suppress said nuisance and to abate any such nuisance as is described in the first section of this Ordinance.

Section 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof in the Municipal Court, be punished by fine not exceeding Three hundred (\$300.00) Dollars or by imprisonment in the City jail for a period not exceeding one hundred (100) days, or by both fine and imprisonment.

Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
