

ORDINANCE NO. 188A

INTRODUCED BY COMMISSIONER Geo. P. Hizer

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE NUMBER 120 PASSED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS, THEN KNOWN AS THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WARRENTON, OREGON ON THE 20th DAY OF JULY, 1914, WHICH SAID ORDINANCE HAD FOR ITS PURPOSE THE PROHIBITING OF ALL EXAGGERATED DANCES OR DANCING AND PROHIBITING THE USE OF TOBACCO IN ANY FORM IN ANY DANCE HALL AND PROVIDING FOR PUNISHMENT FOR VIOLATION OF SAID ORDINANCE.

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Ordinance No. 120, which was an ordinance prohibiting all exaggerated or disorderly dances or dancing and prohibiting the use of tobacco in any form in any dance hall and providing punishment for violation of said ordinance, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Passed by the Commissioners of the City of Warrenton this 13<sup>th</sup> day of ~~September~~ October, 1936.
