ORDINANCE NO. 196

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF BICYCLES AND MOTORCYCLES ON THE STREETS IN THE CITY OF WARRENTON, AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride a bicycle or motorcycle on the streets and alleys of the City of Warrenton at a greater rate of speed than ten miles per hour and such bicycles and motorcycles so ridden must have attached to it, a bell, horn or other instrument which is capable of giving suitable warning of their approach to or near individuals on the streets or alleys of the City of Warrenton, and each must have attached thereto, a suitable lamp or lantern which must be lighted after sunset and before dark, and all persons riding bicycles or motorcycles must at all times give sufficient warning to pedestrians and others of their approach in order to prevent accidents and collisions..

Section 2. It shall be unlawful to ride any motorcycle or motorcycles on any of the sidewalks in any part or parts of the City of Warrenton within its corporate boundaries, and it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to ride a bicycle on any sidewalk on any street or streets through which the County Road of the County of Clatsop runs, commencing at the city limits on the East boundary of the City of Warrenton and running through the City of Warrenton, and to its corporate limits on the West and through the City of Warrenton running to Flavel to that point where Massachusetts Avenue intersects First Street at Flavel, the said County Road running through the City of Warrenton being known as the Columbia Highway, providing however, that bicycles may be ridden on sidewalks in all other parts of the city except on the main streets thereof if equipped with lights and warning signals as provided in Section 1 of this Ordinance, and no bicycles shall be ridden on any sidewalk at a greater rate of speed than eight miles per hour and the riders thereof must dismount upon meeting or passing any pedestrian on such sidewalk.

Section 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of

this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) or more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) or by imprisonment in the City jail not less than two (2) or more than twenty-five (25) days for each offense.

Section 4. That all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5. Inasmuch as the objects to be obtained by this Ordinance will be of great benefit to the people of the City of Warrenton and there exists and is an urgent necessity that this Ordinance should take effect as soon as possible so that the health, peace and safety of the people of the City of Warrenton may be preserved, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this section, therefore, shall take effect when approved by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members of the Common Council, and this Ordinance shall then be in full force and effect, immediately after its approval by the Mayor of the City of Warrenton.
