ORDINANCE NO. 201

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE STORAGE OF COMBUSTIBLE MATERIAL, INCLUDING PETROLEUM, GASOLINE OR ANY OTHER PRODUCT OF A COMBUSTIBLE NATURE, *Except Crude Oil,* WITHIN THE CITY OF WARRENTON, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. No person or persons, firm or corporation shall keep or offer for sale any gunpowder, giant powder, gun cotton or any other explosive substance having an explosive power equal to ordinary gunpowder, in quantities greater than fifty pounds, in any one place in the City of Warrenton, and which shall be kept in an air tight metallic vessel marked with the name of the substance in plain Roman letters not less than three inches in height and proportionate in width, and which vessel shall at all times be kept conspicuously in view near the entrance of the premises where kept, and convenient for removal therefrom.

Section 2. No steamship, vessel, or other water craft shall enter the City of Warrenton while having on board any blasting powder, gunpowder, dynamite or explosive compounds used for blasting purposes; provided, that this section shall not apply to steamships, vessels or other water craft passing up or down the Columbia River to points outside of the city limits, and such vessels so bound shall not be anchored, or moored within the said City or remain within the city longer than is absolutely necessary in transit.

Section 3. No person shall convey or assist in conveying in any vehicle any gunpowder, unless the same shall be securely packed in close packages nor unless such packages shall be securely covered while in the vehicle.

Section 4. No person or persons, firm or corporation shall keep, store or permit to be stored on their or its premises any lacquer in quantities of more than one hundred gallons in any store, warehouse, cannery or any other place within the corporate limits of the City of Warrenton, and such lacquer shall be enclosed in a metallic tank with air tight cap and faucet, and shall be one hundred feet away from all fire, soldering pots, solder and boiler furnaces, stoves and all other receptacles for fire, and the contents of such tank shall be marked



Warrenton and there exists and is an urgent necessity that this ordinance should take effect as soon as possible, so that the health, peace and safety of the people of the City of Warrenton may be preserved, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this section, therefore, shall take effect when approved by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members of the Common Council, and this ordinance shall then be in full force and operative immediately after its approval by the Mayor of the City of Warrenton.
