

ORDINANCE NO 228

An ordinance to regulate the driving, running and riding of automobiles, oldsmobiles, motor cycles, and all other motors and traction machines operated by gasoline, electricity, steam or other ~~mot~~ive power (other than ~~electricity~~ and steam railways,) and provide for lighting the same after night. *and declaring an emergency*

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. No person ~~or~~ persons shall ride, operate or drive any automobile, oldsmobile, motor cycle, or any other motor vehicle operated or driven by gasoline, electricity, steam or other ~~mot~~ive power (except electric and steam railway) within the corporate limits of the City of Warrenton, at a greater speed than 18 miles per hour.

Section 2. No person or persons shall ride, drive or operate any automobile, oldsmobile, motor cycle or other vehicle operated by gasoline, electricity or steam or other ~~mot~~ive power within the corporate limits of the City of Warrenton, between sunset and sun rise without a head light or lights affixed thereon and lighted.

Section 3. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor, and upon conviction therefore before the Police Court shall be fined not less than five (\$5.00) nor more than one hundred (\$100.00) dollars, or be imprisoned in the City Jail not exceeding fifty (50) days.

Section 4. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in *conflict* herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5. Inasmuch as the objects to be obtained by this ordinance will be of great benefit to the people of the City of Warrenton, and there exists and is an urgent necessity that th is ordinance should take effect as soon as possible, so that the health

peace and safety of the people of the City of Warrenton may be preserved, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this section therefore, shall take effect when adopted by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members of the Common Council, and this ordinance shall then be in full force and effect, immediately after its approval by the Mayor of the City of Warrenton.
