

ORDINANCE NO. 236

AN ORDINANCE establishing the grade on Hemlock Street in the City of Warrenton, Clatsop County, Oregon, from the South line of 4th Street to the North line of 5th Street in said City, and declaring an emergency.

THE CITY OF WARRENTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the grade on Hemlock Street in the City of Warrenton, Clatsop County, Oregon, be and the same is hereby established at the following elevation above ~~the base of grades~~ ^{Sea level} as established by the U. S. C. & G. S., at Fort Stevens, said base being mean lower low water mark, to-wit: Hemlock Street at its intersection with the South Line of 4th Street at 12.50 feet above ~~the base of grades~~ ^{Sea level}, Hemlock Street at its intersection with the north line of 5th Street at 13.50 feet above ~~the base of grades~~ ^{Sea Level}. That between the points above designated, the grade shall be upon an even and gradual slope.

Section 2. That upon the passage and approval of this Ordinance, the Auditor and Police Judge of the City of Warrenton, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to cause public notice thereof to be given in conformity with Section 65 of the Charter of the City of Warrenton.

Section 3. Inasmuch as the objects to be obtained by this Ordinance will be of great benefit to the people of the City of Warrenton, and there exists and is an urgent necessity that this Ordinance should take effect as soon as possible, so that the health, peace and safety of the people of the City of Warrenton may be preserved, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Section therefore, shall take effect when adopted by the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all the members of the Common Council, and this Ordinance shall then be in full force and effect immediately after its approval by the Mayor of the City of Warrenton.
